Dear Licensees,

On July 1, 2020, Nexstar Broadcasting, Inc. (Licensee), the licensee of Stations WVNS-TV, Lewisburg, West Virginia (WVNS) and WLAX, La Crosse, Wisconsin (collectively "Stations") filed the above captioned applications seeking an extension of the Stations' construction permit expiration dates and waiver of the 90-day construction permit extension filing deadline. For the reasons below, we grant Licensee's requests and extend the Stations' construction permit expiration dates 180 days to December 30, 2020.

*Background.* Pursuant to Section 73.3700(b)(5) of the Commission's rules, a station may request a single extension of its construction permit deadline of up to 180 days to complete construction of its post-auction facility.<sup>1</sup> Grant of an extension of the construction permit deadline does not alter the deadline by which a station must cease operating on its pre-auction channel. A station anticipating the need for an extension must submit an extension application using FCC Form 2100, Schedule 337, not less than 90 days before the assigned construction permit deadline.<sup>2</sup> For Phase 10 stations, such application was due by April 6, 2020. The application must demonstrate that the station is unable to complete

construction on time due to circumstances that were either unforeseeable or beyond the station's control.<sup>3</sup> In addition, a waiver of the application filing deadline is appropriate where the particular facts would make strict compliance inconsistent with the public interest and deviation from the general rule would relieve hardship, promote equity, or produce a more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis.<sup>4</sup>

WVNS was repacked from channel 8 to channel 11 and WLAX from channel 17 to channel 33; and the Stations were assigned to transition Phase 10 which has a phase completion date of July 3, 2020. All repacked stations for Phase 10 were issued a construction permit with an expiration date of July 3, 2020. Licensee pledges that the Stations will cease operation on their pre-auction channels by the phase completion date and operate interim facilities on their post-auction channels while they complete construction of their permanent post-auction facilities.<sup>5</sup>

Licensee states that it has encountered last minute technical issues associated with tuning WVNS' post-auction channel antenna. As for WLAX, Licensee states that the Station's post-auction channel antenna has not yet been installed due to rigging delays and delays related to the COVID-19 pandemic.<sup>6</sup> In light of these facts, and ongoing uncertainty with the construction schedule, Licensee requests 180-day extensions of the Stations' construction permits to December 30, 2020.

Licensee also requests a waiver of the 90-day construction permit extension filing deadline because it did not know for certain it would require an extension at the time of the deadline.

*Discussion.* Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find Licensee's requests to extend the construction permit deadline to construct the Stations' post-auction facility meet the requirements for a construction permit extension. Licensee has demonstrated that an extension is needed because of construction delays. We also find that grant of these extension requests is not likely to negatively impact the overall transition schedule. The Stations will cease operations on their pre-auction channels by the Phase 10 completion date and will either remain silent or operate interim facilities on their post-auction channels. To the extent some viewers are unable to receive the Stations' signals while they are either silent or operating their interim facilities, we believe that Licensee has every incentive to ensure viewers are fully informed about the Stations' transition plans. Finally, we find that waiver of the 90-day construction permit extension filing deadline is in the public interest and consistent with the

Commission's general waiver standard because Licensee was unaware at the time an extension request was due that an extension of the Stations' construction permits would be needed.<sup>7</sup>

We remind Licensee that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Stations are eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other."<sup>8</sup> Additional expenses incurred, for instance, as a result of the grant of changes in the Stations' transition plans that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

The above facts considered, Nexstar Broadcasting, Inc.'s applications for extension of construction permit expiration date **ARE GRANTED**. The construction permits (LMS File Nos. 0000029890 and 0000027619, respectively) for WVNS-TV, Lewisburg, West Virginia and WLAX, La Crosse, Wisconsin, **ARE EXTENDED 180 days to December 30, 2020**. Grant of these extensions does not permit the Stations to recommence operation on their pre-auction channels after ceasing operation or after July 3, 2020, whichever occurs first. We also remind Licensee that any subsequent requests for extension of their construction permit deadline will be subject to the Commission's tolling provisions.<sup>9</sup>
