Dear Licensee:

We are writing to inquire to the operational status of K23LB-D, Fargo, North Dakota (Station), licensed to Frank Digital Broadcasting, LLC. It has come to our attention that the Station may have been silent for more than one year. Accordingly, please provide us with the current operational status of the Station, and any dates or time windows during which the Station was not operating since September 26, 2016. All responses should be supported by the declaration of a person or persons with personal knowledge.<sup>1</sup> Failure to respond to this request within 45 days of the date of this letter may result in issuance of an Order to Show Cause why the license should not be revoked,<sup>2</sup> or further action by the Commission regarding the Station pursuant to section 312(g) of the Communications Act.<sup>3</sup> Please upload responses in PDF format to the Commission's Licensing and Management System, and email such responses, as well as direct any questions, to Andrew Manley at [andrew.manley@fcc.gov](mailto:andrew.manley@fcc.gov).

(Providing that "If a broadcasting station fails to transmit broadcast signals for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, notwithstanding any provision, term, or condition of the license to the contrary, except that the Commission may extend or reinstate such station license if the holder of the station license prevails in an administrative or judicial appeal, the applicable law changes, or for any other reason to promote equity and fairness."). A station's operation must be pursuant to a Commission authorization, and the Communications Act defines "broadcasting" as "the dissemination of radio communications intended to be received by the public . . .". 47 U.S.C. § 153(6).
