Station did not timely upload its EEO Public File Report for 2016-2017 (the “2016-2017 Report”) because of the impact of Hurricane Irma, which made landfall in Station’s DMA. Due to Hurricane Irma, the FCC extended the October 1, 2017 EEO Public File Report filing deadline for stations in Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands (DA 17-870), provided for extensions for annual EEO reports for MVPDs (DA 17-889), postponed the deadlines for reports regarding EAS Test Reporting Systems, (DA 17-922) and postponed regulatory fee payments (DA 17-901). Station’s deadline for uploading its 2016-2017 Report remained the same, however, despite Hurricane Irma’s destructive effects in South Florida, including in Station’s DMA. As previously disclosed in the Station’s online public inspection file, Hurricane Irma resulted in a loss of power, transmitter damage, and disruption to the lives of employees, which prevented Station from timely uploading the 2016-2017 Report. Station uploaded the 2016-2017 Report as soon as it could (October 17, 2017) and has met every other deadline for filing EEO Public File Reports during the period covered by this Form 303-S.

Station has confirmed that its online public file currently contains an up-to-date list of contracts, in accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 73.3526(e)(5). In the course of preparing this Form 303-S, however, the Station discovered that its online public file did not contain such an up-to-date list. Station’s most recent Ownership Report (dated January 2020) contained a list of contracts updated for that filing, but Station had not separately provided an up-to-date list of contracts in its file. Upon discovering this issue, Station promptly posted an up-to-date list of contracts to reflect its agreements, including those that had been extended or automatically renewed in 2020. Station is also undertaking measures to ensure that the list remains up-to-date. For instance, Station has reviewed the requirements of Section 73.3526(e)(5) with counsel, reinforced those requirements with staff, and developed a procedure to ensure updated lists are timely added to the file to reflect newly executed documents, amendments, supplements, and cancellations when required.
