

The licensee has reviewed the station's online public inspection file to ensure that it is complete. The station believed that it had timely migrated all items it was required to upload to the new online public inspection file by the March 2018 deadline to do so. However, upon conducting a download of the file's contents shortly after the March 2018 deadline, it was noticed that the EEO Public Inspection File report for 2013-2014 was missing, despite the file history reflecting that it had been uploaded. It appears the file may have been misnamed or some other technical difficulty occurred, so the report was then re-uploaded approximately two weeks after the original deadline. In addition, the local listing of programming responsive to community issues for the First Quarter of 2018, the first one for which online filing was required, was uploaded to the online public inspection file six calendar days late due to the station adjusting to the new procedures and defining responsibility for timely uploading of documents to the new online public inspection file. Finally, the 2019 EEO Public Inspection File report was uploaded late due to inadvertence.
