COMMUNITY OF LICENSE CHANGE - 307(b) CONSIDERATION

With this Application, Omni Broadcasting, LLC (OMNI) seeks a minor change of city of license from Port St Joe Florida to Youngstown Florida with a one-step downgrade of station WTKP(FM) FACID 67579 from Class C2 to Class C3.

The minor change of the city of license is pursuant to the provisions of MB Docket 05-210 which became effective on January 19th, 2007. This docket allows for city of license changes, under certain provisions, to be filed as a minor change application on FCC form 301 for AM and FM broadcast stations. OMNI believes this application meets the provisions under MB Docket 05-210 for a change in authorized communities for WTKP(FM). The docket emphasizes the desire to avoid any losses of service to communities while providing the most efficient usage of spectrum. This change of city of license is requested based on Priority 1, first full time aural service and the demonstration that there will be no grey or white area left behind in the allocation scheme upon the grant of this instant request.

Port St Joe Florida is currently the city of license for WTKP (FM) and is one of three aural services allotted there. This instant application on FCC Form 301 is being filed to request that station WTKP (FM) be allotted to Youngstown Florida as first aural local service. This can be accomplished within the current allocation scheme with no changes to the table of vacant allocations. The proposed allotment of WTKP(FM) to Youngstown Florida is mutually exclusive with the current allotment of WTPK(FM) in Port St Joe Florida and meets the allocation requirements of 73.207.

The proposed new community, Youngstown Florida, does not have any full power AM, FM or TV station authorized to it; therefore, the re-allotment of WTPK(FM) to Youngstown will be the community's first full power local service. The viability of Youngstown as a FCC City of License is presented below.

The community of Port St Joe Florida has the following facilities authorized:

Demonstrating the absence of any white or grey area left by the re-allotment of WTKP to Youngtown Florida.

The public interest supports a change of city of license for WTKP (FM) from Port St Joe Florida which will remain served with other local aural services, while Youngstown Florida will benefit from its first local aural service of WTKP(FM).

The area and population with the 70 dBu contours of the station are as follows: The population within the current 70dBu contour of the licensed facility of WTKP (FM) at Port St Joe is 13,555 persons and an area of 2,488 sq. km. The new proposed contours for the allotment at Youngstown will be 102,864 persons and an area of 971.5 sq. km.

Youngstown Florida is an unincorporated community in Bay County, Florida. As of the most recent count, the population of Youngstown is 696, comprised of 56% male and 44% female with a median age of 36.4 for males and 38.7 for females.

While it is a part of the Panama City Metropolitan area, Youngstown has a clear autonomous existence. The community has

its own Post Office with zip code 32466, and is home to 2 local Volunteer Fire Departments. The community is the home of Waller Elementary School hosting Pre-K to 5th grade students. The community has 4 local churches, a lumber company, automotive service shops, firearms store, several restaurants & national chain stores, and regional retail establishments.

Youngstown Florida is renowned for a mysterious train disaster that took place in 1978 when a train wreck caused a chemical spill that resulted in 8 deaths from the noxious cloud formed by the spill. After nearly a year of investigation by the NTSB and the FBI, no solid conclusion could be reached and no arrests in the matter were ever made.
