Our V.P. of Development also reached out to personal contacts (individuals) he knows to assist in reaching qualified candidates to apply for the Development department openings.
- 3. Recruitment source of each person hired and recruitment source for each person interviewed for full-time vacancies:
 - Member / Donor Outreach Coordinator filled July 2019 person hired was referred by a posting on the WNIN website 4 others were interviewed, 1 a current WNIN employee, 1 referred by her professor at the University of Southern Indiana, and 2 referred by a posting on Indeed.com (1 of these also saw the posting on the WNIN website).
 - Radio Host / Operations Director filled September 2019 person hired was a former WNIN employee and was referred by a current WNIN staff member 5 others were interviewed, 1 referred by a current WNIN staff member, 1 a current WNIN part-time employee, 2 referred by a posting on Indeed.com, and 1 referred by a posting on the Western Kentucky University job postings (Handshake).
 - <u>Multi-Media Journalist</u> full-time position has not been filled we hired a part-time employee who was referred by a posting on the WNIN website –no other candidates have been interviewed at this time. If we decide to fill the position with a full-time employee we will repost the opening, do broad and inclusive outreach, and interview multiple candidates before it is filled.
 - <u>Donor Outreach Coordinator / Digital Funding</u> filled March 2020 person hired met with our recruiter at the University of Southern Indiana career fair in February 2020 7 others were interviewed, 1 referred by a current WNIN staff member, 3 referred by a posting on Indeed.com, 1 referred by a posting on the WNIN website, 1 referred by her professor at the University of Southern Indiana, and 1 a current WNIN employee.
 - <u>Account Executive</u> filled October 2019 person hired was referred by a current WNIN employee (hiree worked in a similar capacity at another TV station previously for this employee when he was their CEO. 6 others were interviewed, 2 referred by personal contacts the V. P. of Development had, 1 was a current WNIN employee, and 3 referred by a posting on Indeed.com.

- 4. A total of 27 people were interviewed for the above 5 full-time vacancies that were filled during the period. The number of interviewees referred by each recruitment source is as follows. Resumes were also received that had been referred by a number of other sources used for posting the openings, including WorkOne of Southwest Indiana, Ivy Tech Career Services, TVJobs, CPB Jobline, University of Evansville Career Services, Facebook and Other Social Media postings, and others.

- 5. Recruitment Initiatives undertaken by WNIN during this period:
 - #1 WNIN participated in 2 job fairs at the University of Evansville on September 17, 2019 and February 11, 2020. A number of students stopped to speak with our recruiter, our VP of Finance and Administration, about internships and employment opportunities, many of whom were members of various diverse segments of society. We are working to line up internships with students who stopped by. WNIN offers internships in Radio, TV, Digital Media, events, and engineering with students from all area universities.
 - #1 WNIN participated in 2 job fairs at the University of Southern Indiana on September 18, 2019 and February 19, 2020. Many students stopped and talked with our recruiter at each fair, our Vice President of Finance and Administration, about internships and current full-time and part-time job openings. We hired several interns from these career fairs, and a new full-time employee from the spring career fair.
 - #1 WNIN participated in a career fair at Ivy Tech on February 12, 2020 geared to technology students including communications and media majors. Ivy Tech holds 3 different career fairs each targeted to specific majors and areas of interest each year. We recruited for all openings we had – full-time and part-time jobs, internships, and event volunteers, and received several referrals from contacts made at the fair.
 - #1 WNIN participated in a job fair at the Southern Indiana Career and Technical Center on November 6, 2019. This was geared towards Junior and Senior high school students who were looking for jobs and internships in specific fields including broadcasting, broadcast engineering, and journalism. The manager of the student radio station at the center is a former WNIN employee. We hired a student recruited from the career fair for an Engineering internship for the spring semester 2020, who wants to work in Broadcast Engineering.
 - #1 WNIN participated in 2 community job fairs sponsored by WorkOne, Indiana's workforce development organization on April 17, 2019 and January 16, 2020. Many candidates talked with our recruiter about several full-time and part-time openings we had,

and several qualified applicants were referred to our hiring managers for consideration. A number of the attendees were between jobs and were available for immediate work.

- #4 WNIN participated WNIN participated in an activity sponsored by a community group to inform others about employment opportunities in broadcasting. We hosted 2 eighth grade students from Helfrich Park Middle School on December 6, 2019 as part of the National Job Shadow program sponsored by Junior Achievement. This provided the students an opportunity to work with WNIN content, production, and development staff in both TV and Radio, where the students produced a short film in groups.
- #4 WNIN participated in a Career Day educational event at Central High School for high school seniors on October 30, 2019. Our VP of Finance and Administration gave a presentation to and answered questions to 4 different classes about types of career opportunities in broadcasting and media, the education and training requirements for these jobs, and suggestions of how to best prepare for work in this field including college internships. 15-20 other employers also participated.
- #4 WNIN participated in a Career Day at Reitz Memorial High School on February 13, 2020 geared to all grade levels. Students participated by classes, visiting different employers to learn about career opportunities available, and the education/training required for these jobs. We spoke to students about types of career opportunities in public media along with the education/training required.
- #4 WNIN participated in Job Spark sponsored by the Public Education Foundation and Junior Achievement on October 1 & 2, 2019. Over 3,000 students participated in many hands on educational activities within each career cluster to help them learn about potential future careers and the educational requirements for different careers. We developed a computer-based activity providing students with tips on detecting fake news that included an interactive game on fake vs. real news for students to test their knowledge, with 3 different quizzes available; we also provided handouts with fact checking tips and websites to assist them as a means to help them with current schoolwork and in a future career. The students came from many area middle and high schools (8th 12th grade), and we helped them learn about public media, broadcasting and journalism careers. This was a very popular activity and many students participated.
- #5 Establishment of an internship program. WNIN's internship program continues to successfully work with a number of students per year from local, regional, and other colleges and universities including the University of Southern Indiana, University of Evansville, Ivy Tech, and others; and 2 high school seniors from the Southern Indiana Career and Technical Center this past year. These internships spanned all semesters, spring, summer and fall, and our interns were all part of their school's formal internship programs. College students worked at least 150 hours, and all students received school credit for their internships. Student interns work at WNIN in TV, station events (Auction, Kid's Fest, and other station events), communications, engineering, and radio (news/reporting and Que Pasa Midwest? Podcast/social media). We are currently recruiting students for internships in the summer and fall of 2020 in all these areas after the recent round of spring job fairs, and have already hired 2 digital interns for the summer.

- #7- WNIN participates in ongoing job training. Many employees attend local seminars and training opportunities to develop and enhance their skills and job performance, including skills to perform other jobs of interest. Our VP of Finance and Administration attended several local seminars on employee benefit and human resource topics, a seminar on hiring foreign nationals including students, and recent training on the Indiana InterNET program and Earn Indiana which provides funding assistance for student interns. 5 WNIN staff members participated in a 2-day statewide IPBS conference in October 2019, with numerous participants from all public TV and Radio stations in Indiana; participants attended sessions on a variety of topics including programming, programming, and underwriting. 4 WNIN staff members attended the PBS annual conference in May 2019, providing valuable networking and educational opportunities. Our Director of Corporate Development participated in a one-year CSPI Mentor Program (leadership development) sponsored by PBS in calendar year 2019. WNIN's new Digital Content and Media Manager attended a national 1-day training program in September 2019, and is currently participating in a CPB sponsored Editorial Integrity and Leadership Initiative run by the Walter Kronkite School of Journalism. Our VP of Radio participated in the Public Radio News Directors conference in summer 2019.
