Online Public Inspection File Certification

Scripps Broadcasting Holdings, LLC (“Scripps”), licensee of the station that is the subject of the instant application (the “Station”), hereby certifies that except as described herein, the Station has timely placed in its online public inspection file all documents required to be placed in the file by 47 C.F.R. § 73.3526 and otherwise has complied with the Commission’s public inspection file requirements in all material respects. Scripps hereby discloses that the Station did not timely upload the third quarter 2019 commercial limits certification to the online public file.

On September 19, 2019, the license for the Station was transferred to the Station’s current owner pursuant to a long form transfer of control application (BAL-201900403ACH). Scripps notes that because of the long-form ownership change, the current owners are not liable for the violations of the prior licensee. However, out of an abundance of caution, Scripps discloses that the previous licensee failed to timely upload the fourth quarter 2013, first quarter 2014 and third quarter 2017 issues/programs lists as well as the third quarter 2017 commercial limits certification.

Scripps requires its stations to comply with all FCC rules, including the rules for the political public file. Scripps employees are trained on FCC political public file compliance and Scripps has instituted a program under which station political public files are reviewed for completeness and timeliness. Nevertheless, while the Station has substantially complied with the political public file requirements, a few documents may have been uploaded to the political public file outside of Scripps’s requirement that all documents be uploaded within one business day. In addition, Scripps has determined that while the Station uploaded political public file materials as they were received, in September/October 2020 the Station went back and reviewed and updated its records. The original materials were removed from the online file and the updated files show the dates of the review and not the date the orders and other materials were originally uploaded. Accordingly, while the original materials were timely filed, the dates shown in the public file make it appear as if most of the materials from the 2020 election cycle were uploaded late. Scripps has counseled the Station to keep original materials in the political public file in the future and to designate revisions to the documents in the file through the file names so that this problem will not reoccur going forward. Scripps will continue to work with its stations to ensure that all political public file materials are uploaded in a timely manner.
