

KDCG-CD Online Public Inspection File

During its most recent license term, KDCG-CD) (Facility ID No. 349), Opelousas, LA, did not fully comply with certain online public inspection file (OPIF) requirements as provided in Section 73.3526 of the Commission’s rules:¹

2019-2020 EEO Public File Report- This report was timely prepared and uploaded to the *station’s website* but licensee inadvertently failed to upload it to the OPIF. When this was discovered in preparation for the application it was uploaded to the OPIF.

2013 Q3 Children’s TV Report. This report was timely prepared but due to personnel change, it was uploaded a few days late.

Continuing Class A Eligibility Certifications. The 2016 Q2-Q4, 2017, and Q1, Q2 2018 certifications were timely uploaded but were originally attached to the Children’s TV reports. In preparing for the submission of its license renewal it was discovered there was an inadvertent upload omission of the Q1 2016 report due to a change in staff. All reports were corrected immediately upon notice.

2013 Q3 Issues/Programs List. In preparing for the submission of its license renewal, it was discovered that, while the 2013 Q3 report was timely prepared and placed in the former paper public file, the licensee inadvertently neglected to upload it to the OPIF. It was uploaded a few days late.

2016, 2017 and Q1-2 2018 Issues/Programs Lists. These reports were initially uploaded as exhibits to the Children’s TV Reports. When this error was discovered as part of a self-audit in July 2018, they were re-uploaded to the correct file.

2020 Q1, Q2 and Q3 Issues Programs Lists. With the COVID pandemic disrupting work flow and employees working remotely, miscommunication occurred among the parties who compile the report. Additionally, on Friday Oct. 9th, the Lafayette area was hit hard by Hurricane Delta. The preparation and recovery were overwhelming. Our stations were off the air for several days; focus was on getting lost revenue back in and employees taking care of their families. These reports were uploaded late but are in the file.

Political Files. The Licensee uploaded more than five political files late in 2019. The Licensee has always acted in good faith and tries to upload the political materials in a timely manner. Licensee did encounter upload issues on the FCC’s web site with the site hanging and then ultimately rejecting uploads so they had to be done again; sometimes resulting in “late” uploads. The Licensee is aware of the recently articulated FCC informal policy that political documents must be uploaded within 24 hours/one business day and invoices within one week, and Licensee intends to comply.
