

Online Public Inspection File

During the last license renewal term, Carlos A. Duharte (“Licensee”), licensee of KZSF, San Jose, California, (Facility ID No. 68841) (“KZSF”), failed to fully comply with certain Online Public Inspection File (“OPIF”) requirements.

Issues/Programs List. Licensee inadvertently failed to timely upload several of its Issues/Programs Lists to KZSF’s OPIF. As the Commission knows, many radio stations failed to meet the OPIF transition deadline. In KZSF’s case, its 2013-2017 Issues/Programs Lists were uploaded a few days after the March 1, 2018 transition deadline on March 7, March 13, and March 15. In addition, KZSF’s Q2 and Q3 2018 lists were uploaded late on December 14, 2018, and its Q3 2019 list was uploaded four days late on October 14, 2019. Finally, while KZSF’s Q4 2019-Q2 2021 Issues/Programs Lists were timely uploaded, the lists were uploaded to the Additional Documents folder of the Station’s AM Radio Information tab. Those lists have now also been moved to the Issues and Programs Lists folder for the Station.

Licensee appreciates its obligation to fully and timely comply with the FCC’s rules. Without excusing the late upload of several KZSF’s Issues/Programs Lists, Licensee would note that the Commission is well-aware of the challenges many stations, especially smaller stations, had in transitioning to the OPIF. KZSF’s lists are now in its OPIF. In addition, since completing the OPIF transition, KZSF’s Issues/Programs Lists have routinely been uploaded on time. Licensee, therefore, believes the internal procedures and policies that have been adopted will ensure future lists are uploaded on time.
