Public Inspection File

In preparing its license renewal filing, the station conducted an audit of its online public file. It determined that the following material was not timely uploaded to the online public file:

- 3Q 2014 and 4Q 2014 Children's Programming Commercial Limits Certifications.
- 3Q 2014 and 4Q 2014 Issues and Programs Reports.

These documents were timely prepared and placed in the station's paper public file.

WTVO-TV is committed to uploading political file material as soon as possible consistent with Commission guidance. In reviewing the political file material uploaded over the past two years, the station has determined that a very limited number of orders were not uploaded within one business day. In most of those cases, orders were timely uploaded to the political file but were placed in the wrong folder. After a recent internal audit revealed the error, the orders were re-uploaded, this time to the correct folder. In the process of re-uploading the orders, however, the orders originally uploaded to the wrong folders were deleted. Thus, some of the re-uploaded orders appear to be late-filed when, in fact, they were timely filed. Station management has providing training to the staff responsible for uploading political material to the online file to ensure that political material is timely and correctly uploaded.

EEO Public File Reports
