

Biennial Ownership Report Exhibit

During the due diligence review performed in connection with preparation of this license renewal application, it was discovered that the licensee's biennial ownership report for 2019 was not in its stations' online public inspection files and could not be located in the FCC's databases.

It appears from the licensee's records that the licensee provided information for the 2019 biennial ownership report to its attorney to prepare and file the report. However, due to an apparent oversight by that attorney the report was not completed and filed, and this failure was not discovered until recently during preparation of the license renewal applications for licensee's stations. Other than the start of COVID-19 pandemic around the time of the January 31, 2020 deadline for filing the 2019 biennial ownership reports (on January 21 the first coronavirus case in the US was confirmed to have infected a Washington state resident; the WHO declared a global health emergency on January 31, and the US government declared a national health emergency on February 3), there are no specific reasons for the missing 2019 biennial ownership report or why the failure to file was not discovered until recently.

At this time, preparing and filing a late 2019 biennial ownership report is not possible in the FCC's LMS system, presumably because the window is about to open soon for preparation of 2021 biennial ownership reports.

The licensee is aware of the requirement to file a biennial ownership report every two years, and to verify that the report is both filed and uploaded to the station's online public file. The licensee will provide current information and ensure that the 2021 biennial ownership report is completed and filed in LMS on time during the October 1 – November 30, 2021, window.
