Re: Request for Tolling Waiver
WHIG-CD, Rocky Mount, NC

Dear Licensee,

On November 9, 2021, RSS Media Marketing (RSS), the licensee of WHIG-CD, Rocky Mount, North Carolina (WHIG-CD or Station), filed the above-referenced request for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling of the Station's construction permit expiration date. For the reasons below, we grant RSS' request and toll the expiration date of WHIG-CD's construction permit through January 10, 2022.

Background. Pursuant to section 73.3700(b)(5) of the Commission's rules (Rules), a station that was assigned a new channel as a result of the Commission's incentive auction and repacking process may request a single extension of its construction permit deadline of up to 180 days to complete construction of its post-auction facility.¹ All subsequent requests for additional time to construct are subject to the Commission's tolling provisions of section 73.3598(b) of the Rules.² The Commission's tolling provisions provide that a construction permit deadline may be tolled under specific circumstances such as acts of God, delays due to administrative or judicial review, or construction that is delayed by any cause of action pending before a court of competent jurisdiction relating to any necessary local, state, or federal requirement for the construction or operation of the station, including any zoning or environmental requirement.³ If a station does not qualify for tolling under these criteria, good cause may exist to waive the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling may still be warranted where the licensee can demonstrate that "rare and exceptional circumstances" prevented construction by the station's construction permit expiration date.⁴

RSS requests waiver of the tolling rule and tolling of its construction permit for the Station's post-incentive auction channel facilities through January 10, 2022. RSS was granted an extension and multiple waivers of the tolling rule and the Station's construction permit was most recently tolled to November 10, 2021.⁵ The Station is currently operating on its post-auction channel with interim facilities.⁶

As RSS reported in previously waiver filings, construction of the Station's post-auction channel facilities was delayed due to an issue with the structural integrity of the Station's tower. RSS initially planned to modify the Station's tower but a tower study determined that it was not an option. Because RSS was unable to find suitable space on nearby towers to continue to serve its existing viewers, RSS planned to construct a new tower.

Since the grant of its last tolling waiver in August 2021, however, RSS states that the owner of the tower where the Station's temporary facilities are currently located advised RSS that there is space available higher on that tower. In light of this development, RSS maintains that it will avoid building a new tower and relocate its permanent antenna to the higher position on the Station's current tower. RSS is preparing an application for minor modification to specify the higher antenna position and will be filing it shortly. Upon grant, RSS states that it can quickly re-position its antenna to the new higher position within a matter of weeks. Accordingly, RSS requests a waiver of the tolling rules and brief tolling of its construction permit to January 10, 2022.

Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that sufficient circumstances exist to waive the rules and toll the expiration date of the Station's construction permit to January 10, 2022.⁷ RSS has demonstrated it did not complete construction of its post-auction channel facilities due to issues relating to its tower =. We also find that grant of RSS's tolling request is not likely to negatively impact the overall transition schedule and will not cause interference to other stations. WHIG-CD has already ceased operation on its pre-auction channel and initiated temporary operations on its post-auction channel. To the extent some viewers are unable to receive WHIG-CD's signal while it operates using its interim facility, we believe that RSS has every incentive to ensure viewers are fully informed about the Station's transition plan. Ultimately, we conclude that the public interest will be served by grant of tolling of the Station's construction permit.

We remind RSS that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Station is eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other."⁸ Additional expenses incurred, such as expenses resulting from changes in a Station's transition plan that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

We further remind RSS that the deadline for submitting final expense documentation for reimbursement for the Station is **March 22, 2022**.⁹ Thus, we strongly encourage the Station to diligently pursue satisfaction of the current deadlines to improve the chances that there will be sufficient funds available to reimburse the Station for its legitimate repacking expenses, and we encourage RSS to submit eligible invoices as soon as practicable.

The above facts considered, RSS Media Marketing's request for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions **IS GRANTED**. The construction permit (LMS File No. 0000028657) for WHIG-CD, Rocky Mount, North Carolina, **IS TOLLED through January 10, 2022**. Grant of this tolling waiver does not permit WHIG-CD to recommence operation on its pre-auction channel. While we anticipate this will be RSS's final request for tolling, we remind RSS that any subsequent tolling requests will be subject to the Commission's tolling provisions.¹⁰ To the extent the Station seeks an additional extension of tolling, such a request must include a detailed plan for completing construction of the Station's permanent post-auction facilities. We will look unfavorably upon any future request that does not include such a plan.
