

**FCC FORM 2100 – SCHEDULE 303-S
ONLINE PUBLIC INSPECTION FILE EXHIBIT AMENDMENT**

WELU OPIF EXHIBIT AMENDMENT

During its most recent license term, WELU, Toa Baja, PR (Facility ID No. 26602) (formerly of Aguadilla, PR), the licensee of which is Senda Educational Broadcasting Inc (the “Licensee”), did not fully comply with certain online public inspection file (OPIF) requirements as provided in Section 73.3526 of the Commission’s rules.

Pursuant to an email from Joyce Bernstein of the Video Division, Media Bureau, received on October 1, 2021 and follow-up correspondence from Andrew Kennedy of the Media Bureau on October 25, 2021, Licensee found that it did not timely upload its Q2-Q4 2014 and Q1 2015 Issues/Programs Lists during the license period, rather than its Children’s Television Reports, as noted in Licensee’s previous amendment.

These Issues/Programs Lists inadvertently were not timely uploaded after the assignment of WELU from Pabellon Educational Broadcasting, Inc. to Licensee.¹ Licensee notes that it rebroadcasts the programming from WSJN-CD, San Juan, PR. Accordingly, its Issues/Programs Lists are the same as that WSJN-CD’s for this period. These lists have now been uploaded to the WELU OPIF.

Licensee also notes that its Q3 2017 and Q2 2018 Issues/Programs Lists were uploaded untimely to the WELU OPIF. The Q3 2017 List was excused by Public Notice,² but Licensee’s Q2 2018 List was late due to the struggles it experienced in the wake of Hurricane Maria. As noted in a Legal STA filed by WELU,³ the Station channel shares with WSJN-CD, the facilities of which were completely destroyed by Hurricane Maria. Licensee has continued to deal with repercussions from the hurricane for multiple years after the disaster, though the first few months were the most trying, resulting in the delay in uploading Licensee’s Q2 2018 Issues/Programs List.

Lastly, Licensee emphasizes that it takes its responsibilities as a broadcast licensee very seriously, and the station employees who have the responsibility for preparing and maintaining the OPIF have been reminded of the FCC’s requirements with respect to those matters. Further, WELU has implemented procedures to ensure that the required documentation will contain all of the appropriate information and will be placed in the station’s OPIF in a timely manner going forward.
