

Further Eligibility Certifications

As an ocean coastal city located on an isolated peninsula of the Washington Coast, the importance of providing reliable emergency alert safety announcements and prompt guidance to our citizens and visitors under storm or disaster conditions, including tsunami alerts, is highly critical. The current City of Ocean Shores station, KOSW-LP, is an EAS Participating Station and will better serve the citizens with the improved coverage over the community and its environs.

The City of Ocean Shores will expand the scope of the current educational and news components by extending on-air programming opportunities to include the Ocean Shores Library, the local Elementary and Middle-High schools, along with other active community groups working to educate Ocean Shores citizens and to improve our local environment. The vision related to the OS Library includes regularly scheduled on-air book and poetry readings for adults and children.

Some of the other educational and informational programs already regularly broadcast include historical reviews of Grays Harbor County early 19th and 20th century news stories, Quinault Indian Nation Tribal information, the Scientific American 60 second Science Education series, the program Profile America and direct interviews with staff at the Museum of the North Beach and the Coastal Interpretive Center. These are only a few of the programs offered.
