Dear Ms. Dortch:

I write on behalf of the Regents of the University of New Mexico and the Board of Education of Albuquerque, New Mexico, licensee of K31OX-D, Ramah, New Mexico, and K33QD-D, Zuni Pueblo, New Mexico (collectively, the “Stations”).

The Stations operate as “Television Broadcast Translator Stations,” as that term is defined in Section 74.701(a) of the Commission’s rules. The Commission’s records, however, indicate that the Stations are “Low Power TV Stations,” a regulatory distinction that would allow the Stations to originate programming. The Stations do not now (and never have) originated programming. We respectfully request that the Commission update its records to reflect the status of each of the Stations as a “Television Broadcast Translator Station.” Please contact me should you have any questions regarding this request.
