**Operational and Construction Permit  
Status Inquiry**

Dear Licensee:

Based on Commission records, it appears you improperly certified in the license renewal application for low power television (LPTV) station KCPO-LP, Sioux Falls, South Dakota (Station or KCPO) that the Station was operational and had not been silent for more than 30 days at the time of filing.<sup>1</sup> Furthermore, the Station was granted a digital construction permit that expired on January 10, 2022.<sup>2</sup> The Commission has no record that you filed the requisite application for license to cover by the July 13, 2021 the expiration of the construction permit. This letter provides you 30 days to explain these inconsistencies and potential improper certifications, and to clarify whether the Station's digital facility was in fact timely constructed in a manner consistent with its authorization.

As a former analog station, the Station was required to cease analog operation by 11:59 p.m. on July 13, 2021.<sup>3</sup> However, in the Station's December 2021 Renewal Application, you certified that the facility was both operational and that the Station had not been silent for more than 30 days.<sup>4</sup> It thus appears you either failed to make the proper certification in the Station's license renewal application or that the Station was operating (in either analog or digital) without a valid authorization.

Furthermore, on April 20, 2020, the Station was granted a construction permit to flash-cut its analog operations to digital operations on its licensed channel (Channel 26). As a former analog station, the construction permit carried an expiration date of July 13, 2021.<sup>5</sup> On April 28, 2021, the Station was

granted an extension of its construction permit to January 10, 2022.<sup>6</sup> To date, we have no record that you filed an application for license to cover. Section 74.788(b) of the Commission’s rules states that: “Any construction permit for which construction has not been completed and for which an application for license or extension of time has not been filed, shall be automatically forfeited upon expiration without any further affirmative cancellation by the Commission.”<sup>7</sup> As such, the construction permit has been automatically forfeited.<sup>8</sup>

Based on the facts above, you are requested to (1) demonstrate whether the Station’s digital facility was in fact constructed by January 10, 2022; and (2) provide the Station’s operational history since the April 20, 2020 grant date of its last license renewal application.<sup>9</sup> For any period the Station was operational since April 20, 2020, please provide the dates of operation, the Station’s technical operating parameters, mode of operation (i.e., analog or digital), specific evidence of the Station’s operation throughout the entire period of operation, and the valid authorization under which the Station operated.<sup>10</sup> For any period that the Station was silent, please provide the Station’s dates of silence and an explanation for the Station’s silence. To the extent you made incorrect certifications in the Station’s Renewal Application, please explain these inaccuracies.

The written response to this letter must be supported by a declaration from an individual with personal knowledge of the facts and signed under penalty of perjury that the facts and information

provided in the response are both true and correct.<sup>11</sup> If the Station's digital facility has been constructed, the Station is instructed to immediately file a license to cover and, as an attachment, a request for reinstatement of the Station's construction permit and waiver of any applicable rules.<sup>12</sup>

If you fail to reply to this letter and or do not provide all requested information and documents within 30 days from the date of this letter, the Commission's public and internal databases **WILL BE MODIFIED** to indicate that the digital construction permit (File No. 0000139698) for the Station has been automatically **FORFEITED**,<sup>13</sup> the license (File No. BLTTL-20011029AAL) for the Station has been automatically **CANCELED**,<sup>14</sup> the Station's pending application for license renewal (File No. 0000176044) will be **DISMISSED**, and its call sign will be **DELETED**.<sup>15</sup>

If certain information requested cannot be provided, please explain why.
