CAREER OUTREACH INITIATIVES

CAREER OUTREACH

Morning anchor:

10-10-20 - Media liaison and Alumnus to Valene Smith Museum of Anthropology at CSU. During the event she talked to university employees and students about a career in Journalism as it relates to Anthropology and as a stand-alone career.

On March 23rd and 25th she served as judge for the Butte County High School Art Competition. She talked to students about what a career in Broadcast Journalism entails and what it's like being an anchor.

MMJ

Read to students at Concow School for Read Across America Day on March 2nd, 2021. This was done via Zoom. Besides reading to students he answered questions about being an MMJ and what his career path was.

MMJ and Telemundo Reporter

MMJ and Telemundo reporter spoke via Zoom to 50 high school students in the Upward Bound Program who are taking courses at Yuba College on July 12, 2021. She talked to them about being a first-generation college graduate and being a television news reporter. She detailed her path as an intern, a part-time Telemundo producer/weather anchor then a full time MMJ both for the main stations and Telemundo.

TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR EMPLOYEES

MMJ

Started as an entry level MMJ. We trained him how to produce and anchor and now he's our Weekend Anchor and fill-in anchor as needed.

Digital Content Manager

He started as a part time digital producer. We recruited him through our relationship and recruiting partnership with Chico State University. He went through training with our outgoing DCM and corporate digital team and was promoted to full-time DCM.

MMJ/Telemundo Anchor

She started out as an MMJ and expressed interest in working for Telemundo. We trained her how to produce, anchor and do weather and now she's our full-time Telemundo anchor.

The General Manager met with Chico State's journalism professor Dick Stein on multiple occasions. They discussed maintaining our recruiting relationship and specific students. Dick also keeps track of all the students who have come through Action News Now and have gone on to larger TV markets.

He also gave a station tour to a special needs student interested in being a Meteorologist.

MANAGEMENT TRAINING

11/12/2020- The station participated in ensuring that all management went through a certified Sexual Harassment Training. All managers were required to pass and did so.

MENTORING PROGRAM FOR STATION PERSONNEL

During their sessions with the News Director, MMJs discuss career goals, challenges and how to improve their skills to help reach their goals. These consistent meetings have led to MMJs and Reporters moving onto larger markets thus achieving their goals.

COLLEGE RECRUITMENT EFFORTS

News Director reached out to professors at several CA State Universities, Washington State and Millersville University to start a recruitment pipeline for students. These dialogues led to the station hiring two MMJs, one producer, an assignment editor and a digital producer. In addition to these hires, there is now open communication between those universities and the station for future opportunities.
