

COMMUNITY TELEVISION EDUCATORS, INC.
Application for License Renewal

PUBLIC INSPECTION FILE

During the most recent license term, noncommercial educational television station KDTP, Holbrook, Arizona (“Station”) has provided viewers in its community of license and the surrounding areas with excellent public affairs programming aimed at diverse audiences, including news, weather, sports, emergency information and other important current events, as set forth on the Station’s quarterly issues/programs lists.

Due to simple administrative oversight, the Station’s issues/programs lists for Q2 2014, Q3 2016 and Q4 2016 were not uploaded on time to the Station’s online public inspection file (“OPIF”). However, importantly, Community Television Educators, Inc. (“CTE”), the licensee of the Station, has not received any queries or complaints from any member of the public concerning the Station’s programming or the contents of its public inspection file associated with the quarters in which the issues/programs lists were uploaded late (or, indeed, during any part of the Station’s most recent license term). As set forth herein, the reported error was simply ministerial. In addition, it should be noted that CTE has uploaded the issues/programs lists to the Station’s OPIF on time **during every other quarter** of the Station’s preceding eight-year license term.

In summary, CTE has been in overwhelming compliance with the Commission’s rules during the Station’s preceding license term. Accordingly, CTE submits that no Commission action is warranted, and that grant of this license renewal application would serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.
