

MULTICAST HOST EXHIBIT

By way of this application and pursuant to the Commission’s November 16, 2023 Public Notice in MB Docket No. 16-142,¹ Mission Broadcasting, Inc. (“Mission”), the licensee of digital full power television station KASY-TV, RF Channel 36, Albuquerque, New Mexico (FID 55049), requests authorization to broadcast KASY-TV’s four multicast streams in ATSC 1.0 format over the facilities of stations other than KASY-TV as described below. The Commission has previously authorized these multicast hosting arrangements under special temporary authority (“STA”),² and the instant application seeks to license these arrangements, as directed by the *Multicast Licensing PN*, under the newly effective rules adopted in the *Third Next Gen TV Report and Order*.³ Pursuant to the *Third Next Gen TV Report and Order*, Mission provides the following information regarding the proposed multicast hosting:

1. The chart below identifies the hosted multicast streams and the programming on each, the host stations and licensees, and the RF and virtual channel numbers of the hosted streams:

*KWBQ(DT) is also owned by Mission and is KASY-TV’s primary signal ATSC 1.0 simulcast host.

2. The hosted streams will each be in 480i.
3. As demonstrated in the engineering exhibit accompanying this application, the service contours of the respective ATSC 1.0 hosts cover 100% of KASY-TV’s current service area population.
4. The hosted streams will not be simulcast in ATSC 3.0 on KASY-TV.
5. Prior to KASY-TV’s conversion to ATSC 3.0 on December 13, 2022,⁴ the above-listed multicast streams aired in 480i in ATSC 1.0 on KASY-TV. Thus, Mission is not seeking to license more capacity on the host stations than what KASY-TV used prior to its conversion to ATSC 3.0.
