The Arizona Community Media foundation is an educational non-profit corporation with a local board and local Programming Advisory Committee. The Committee will recommendations to the Board concerning potential programs. The Advisory Committee has submitted a number of programming suggestions to the Board, and a proposed programming schedule is attached as Exhibit A.

The overall educational objective is to provide locally based programming which will (1) be a supplement to programs and instruction provided by local educational institutions, (2) provide programming concerning local fine arts not available on existing stations; (3) provide educational programming on matters of health, consumer protection and public safety; 4) provide locally generated programming for several of the largest foreign language speaking minorities; and (5) programming which will promote civic participation and development.

- (1) Supplements to local educational institutions would include science programming, direct or re-broadcast of significant lectures and presentations, ,and programming aimed at listeners who are learning English as a second language;
- (2) Fine arts broadcasting would include radio plays by local theater and acting groups, presentations by local poets and writers, art and art and museum reviews. Changing Hands Bookstore, awarded the Book Publisher's Association award as the best independent bookstore in the United States, has agreed to provide a program of book reviews;

- (3) Health, consumer protection and public safety would include local news programs, presentations by community groups and public agencies. The School of Nursing at Arizona State University has expressed an interest in providing programming about public health issues and access to medical services;
- (4) Foreign language broadcasting for the Haitian, Vietnamese and Korean communities;
- (5) Programming to improve civic participation would include news and analysis of the activities of state and local governments, national and local news broadcasts, local programming by and for Native Americans, locally generated talk shows, high school sports events, and music produced by local musicians and bands.
