As submitted under Exhibit 2, you have a copy of the letter certifying our non-profit status as a religious organization, and the articles of incorporation of our Presbytery. I believe a word of explanation is in order regarding the organization of our local church, Grace OPC, and the larger church to which we belong.

Grace OPC is certified as a subsidiary organization under the Presbytery of Northern California and Nevada of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church (hereafter, "Presbytery"). The Presbytery, or regional church, is composed of representatives from each of the local churches, including ours. In no way does our Presbytery own or control Grace OPC; similar to our appellate court system, our Presbyterian Form of Government is a series of three graded courts, wherein a local church such as ours is autonomous, and only by appeal may the next higher church court (in our case, the Presbytery) exercise authority over the local church. Our Form of Government should not be confused with the more well-known "mainline" Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), which despite its similar name uses a more hierarchical system, where their presbyteries may exercise direct control, for instance, over the local church's temporal affairs, including finances and property rights.

You will see also that our Presbytery's name has changed, from the "Presbytery of the West Coast," which began in January 1964 and was incorporated in 1967, to the "Presbytery of Northern California" (name change filed in 1970 with the Secretary of State). I believe "Nevada" was added to the name in the last several years; I do not have on hand that document personally. At the time that Grace OPC was certified, the name of the Presbytery was "Northern California" as reflected in the certifying letter.

The certifying letter is dated October 7, 1998. That is a conservative, or late, date for the existence of our organization, and if you will permit me a brief history of our church I will explain that as well. Our church has existed under different names as part of this Presbytery since at least 1964, and met at various locations in Modesto. On October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1972, it began meeting at its current location at 1448 Standiford Avenue, and the name of our church was changed to Grace OPC in 1976. Our current pastor, P. Shaun Bryant, has been pastor since 1994. I have examined our church's documents including old church bulletins, and minutes of Session (Church officer) meetings and Trustees' meetings, and have also examined old copies of "The Presbyterian Guardian," an independent Presbyterian periodical published until the 1970s. I am confident that the church has been meeting continuously since at least 1972, though obviously not with the same pastors, elders, and trustees in office. However, I have chosen the 1998 date to answer the question posed, as it is the earliest date I can find solid evidence of our non-profit status.
