On November 24, 1998, the Commission granted its consent to transfer the licenses of over 50 stations from the shareholders of Pulitzer Publishing Company (“Pulitzer”) to Hearst-Argyle Television, Inc. (“Hearst-Argyle”).¹ This transfer was sought in order to effectuate a merger of Pulitzer into Hearst-Argyle Properties, Inc; a wholly owned subsidiary of Hearst-Argyle Television, Inc. Among the stations for which the Commission granted consent to transfer were WYFF, Greenville, South Carolina, and nine of the thirteen television translator stations rebroadcasting the signal of WYFF. Subsequent filings resulted in the assignment of these licenses from Hearst-Argyle Properties, Inc. to the current licensee, its wholly owned subsidiary, WYFF Hearst-Argyle Television, Inc.

It was the intention of all parties to the 1998 transaction that all of WYFF’s television translator stations be transferred to Hearst-Argyle. However, the four translator stations that are the subject of this application were somehow overlooked and were not listed on the filed FCC application.

In order to remedy this oversight, on December 6, 2004, a Form 345 was filed to effectuate the transfer of control of the licensee of these four translator stations, Hearst-Argyle Properties, Inc. from the former shareholders of Pulitzer Publishing Company to Hearst-Argyle. The FCC granted its consent to this transfer on March 15, 2005. In order to finalize this transaction, this pro forma application is being filed to assign the licenses for the four translators from Hearst-Argyle Properties, Inc. to WYFF Hearst-Argyle Television, Inc., the licensee for WYFF.

The relevant agreements for the transfer of WYFF as well as its television translator stations were attached to the applications filed on Form 315 in June 1998. Due to the fact that such agreements are already on file with the Commission and the fact that the agreements were executed over six years ago when the relevant transaction occurred, the agreements are not attached as an Exhibit to this application.
