NORTHERN NASH HIGH SCHOOL

Northern Nash High School is a North Carolina public high school in the Nash Rocky Mount School System. All public schools in North Carolina are under the jurisdiction of the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction. According to our research, Northern Nash High School was built in 1965 and opened in 1966 to serve the educational needs of its students.

If granted, Northern Nash High School proposes to use the LPFM facility to improve our students' 21st century skills by providing real world opportunities to read, write, and speak. Our vision is a station where students produce the programming heard by the community. The station will be programmed for parents during the school day and for students when school is not in session. - Our Social Studies classes learning about history as they produce radio documentaries.
- Our Band classes producing concert programs for our community to enjoy.

The station will also be used to education students and parents in the community.

- The Physical Education classes could produce programs targeting better health for our community through better nutrition and exercise.
- The Foods classes could produce programs teaching our community to prepare healthier meals.
- The Science classes could produce programs that inform the community how to protect our environment.
