

SUPPLEMENT TO EXHIBIT 4

This Supplement is submitted to provide clarification concerning the proposed assignment of the Station from Provo Broadcasting, LLC to Gary M. Cocola, as outlined in Exhibit 4 to the assignment of license application, FCC File No. BAPCT-20020927AAH (the "Application").

In Exhibit 4 to the Application, Provo Broadcasting, LLC submitted the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement (the "Stipulation") dated as of August 12, 2002, pursuant to which at least eighty (80%) of the members of Provo Broadcasting, LLC approved the sale of the Station's permit. This Stipulation was entered into in accordance with the provisions of Section 2(a) of the LLC Agreement, which provides that any sale of the assets of Provo Broadcasting, LLC must be approved by an 80% vote of its members. The only asset currently held by Provo Broadcasting, LLC is the Station's permit.

As explained in Exhibit 4 to the Application, Provo Broadcasting, LLC has twelve (12) members. The Stipulation was signed by the following eleven (11) members - Gary M. Cocola, Channel Thirty-Two Television Company, KM Communications, Richard S. Losee, Turner Enterprises, Winstar Broadcasting Corp., Ronald L. Ulloa, Kaleidoscope Partners, Kimberly Kralowec, Caroline Powley and Venture Technologies Group, LLC - comprising approximately 92% of the members of Provo Broadcasting, LLC. Pat Openshaw, the representative of Channel Thirty-Two Television Company, signed the Stipulation but her signature appears on the signature line for KM Communications. KT Broadcasting did not sign the Stipulation; however, its signature was not necessary inasmuch as at least 80% of the members had signed the Stipulation.

On September 16, 2002, the following ten (10) members of Provo Broadcasting, LLC entered into an Amendment to Settlement and Stipulation Agreement (the "Stipulation Amendment") - Gary M. Cocola, Ronald Ulloa, Channel Thirty-Two Television Company, KM Communications, Richard S. Losee, Turner Enterprises, Kaleidoscope Partners, Kimberly Kralowec, Caroline Powley and Venture Technologies Group, LLC - comprising approximately 83% of Provo Broadcasting, LLC's members. The purpose of the Stipulation Amendment was to modify provisions in the Stipulation relating to selection of an escrow agent, completion of FCC Form 314 for assignment of the permit and the procedures to be followed in the event the FCC did not approve the Application by January 21, 2003. KT Broadcasting and Winstar Broadcasting Corp. did not sign the Stipulation Amendment; however, their signatures were not necessary inasmuch as at least 80% of the members had signed the Stipulation Amendment.

As indicated in the Arbitrator's Report and Order dated September 19, 2002, submitted with Exhibit 4 to the Application, all members participated in the September 18, 2002 auction of the permit.
