

WJMI Ownership Exhibit for Minor Change Application

Urban Radio II, LLC ("Urban Radio II"), the licensee of WJMI, a subsidiary of Inner City Broadcasting Corporation, is the licensee of two clusters of radio stations, one serving the Columbia, South Carolina market and the other serving the Jackson, Mississippi market, as follows:

As noted above, WJMI is part of the Jackson, Mississippi group of radio stations. By its grant issued September 15, 2006 (File No. BAL-20060727AFK), the Commission consented to the assignment of the license of WJNT to Urban Radio II as an addition to its Jackson, Mississippi group of radio stations, expanding that commonly owned group of stations from five to six at that time. That assignment was consummated on October 23, 2006. Consequently, less than a year ago, the Commission affirmatively reviewed and approved the media ownership of Urban Radio II, including for WJMI, and all of the affiliates of Urban Radio II.

Urban Radio II hereby represents that there have been no material changes to: (1) the ownership, control or operations of WJMI, (2) other Urban Radio II radio stations, (3) any of the media interests of Urban Radio II, and (4) any of the media interests of its affiliates, that would result in any violation of the Commission's media ownership rules and policies or that is otherwise materially different from the facts reviewed and approved by the Commission as a consequence of the application for the assignment of the license of WJNT.

In addition, the instant application would not result in any material expansion of the signal or coverage of WJMI. Consequently, the instant application is in full compliance with the Commission's media ownership rules and policies.
