City To Enforce Weeds/Rubbish Ordinance

Important information for citizens:

You may be unaware that the City of New Deal has an ordinance governing Unwholesome Conditions. Due to the recent amount of rain that our area has received, an overgrowth of weeds may be a problem. If you are not aware of the city ordinance, you should take a look at the following information. In part, the ordinance does state:

"It shall be unlawful, for the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land, tract or lot or any portion thereof, regardless of size, within the corporate limits of the City of New Deal, to fail to maintain said property free of weeds, grass and undergrowth over twelve (12) inches tall, or to fail to maintain said property free from household trash, garbage, used building materials and supplies, used and or discarded household fixtures or appliances, toxic materials, stagnant water, dead animals, brush piles, debris, rubbish, material which constitute a fire hazard of any other matter which may be detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the
