

## EXHIBIT NO. 1

The applicant and members of its Board of Directors have for years worked to promote education and culture in and to the community at large.

The stated purposes of the applicant (as set forth in its organizational and operational documents) includes the “advancement of education and culture to the community at large and may include ownership and/or operation of radio stations and media to provide educational and cultural programs and programming.”

Among other things, the applicant has been instrumental for a number of years in working with Nutmeg Conservatory for the Arts in the operation of radio station WAPJ in Torrington, Connecticut. That radio station, which is the subject of this application, is a needed outlet for community news, educational and cultural programming. The applicant has provided funding for the radio station, and several of the members of its Board of Directors have also provided volunteer services to the radio station for several years.

The applicant and its directors have also worked closely with Nutmeg Conservatory for the Arts in helping to provide culture and education to citizens of the Greater Torrington community.

The applicant and some of its Directors have also worked closely with Brooker Memorial Clinic in Torrington, Connecticut, a nonprofit organization that provides health care and health care education to children in the Torrington area. The education programs of the Clinic have provided a much needed service to a growing number of children in the community. Zena Temkin, a member of the applicant's Board of Directors, is a member of the Clinic's Board of Managers.

The applicant, through its President, Isadore Temkin has been involved with the Litchfield County Commission on Higher Education, an organization whose purpose is the advancement of higher education in the Torrington, Connecticut area, and with The Torrington Club, an organization of business people, community leaders, educators and other professionals, that works to better the community from education, cultural and other civic points of perspectives. Dr. Temkin is a member of that Commission and President of the Torrington Club.

The applicant has a number of educational purposes. Through its activities and its support of a variety of non-profit organizations, the applicant has pursued those purposes; they are as follows:

- Educating the general public about the plight of abused women and ways to prevent abuse and help those who are the victims of abuse (both women and their children);
- Educating the general public about the A.I.D.S. epidemic and ways to assist A.I.D.S. victims;
- Educating the general public about the difficulties faced by homeless persons, especially in finding food, and ways in which to assist the homeless and less fortunate in finding food;
- Providing children and the elderly health and health care awareness and education;
- Educating young people and the general public about the importance of obtaining a good education;
- Educating the general public about the general workings of the government and the functions of government (i.e., Civics and community awareness);
- Educating the general public about culture, including, music, dance, theatre, painting and other fine arts, and other cultural pursuits;
- Educating the general public about the difficulties faced by poor children and the need and ways to assist them.

The radio station to be transferred will continue to provide non-commercial educational, cultural and community news programming to the Greater Torrington, Connecticut community. The station was originally approved to fill the need for an educational radio station in Torrington to serve as a badly-needed outlet for community news, educational and cultural programming, and other locally based programs. It continues to fill that need.

The applicant intends to continue this philosophy. This will be easier in light of the extensive assistance to the radio station provided by the applicant and several of its Board members in recent years.

The members of the applicant's Board and its officers, a broad representation of the educational, cultural and civic segments of the Torrington, Connecticut community, have all worked or work, both with the applicant or otherwise, in ways to benefit these segments of the community.
