As reflected in the attached Technical Exhibit, the proposed operation of Station WWME-LD complies with all rule sections specified in Section III, Question 13 of FCC Form 346 other than 47 C.F.R. §74.793(h) with respect to predicted interference to Station W40BY, Palatine, Illinois (File No. BDFCDTT-20060327 ABZ), and WWME-LD's licensee, Channel 23 Limited Partnership, has entered into an interference agreement with the licensee of Station W40DY, TCCSA, Inc. d/b/a Trinity Broadcasting Network ("Trinity"), in which Trinity has consented to such predicted interference and to a grant of the instant application. A copy of that interference agreement is attached as a part of this exhibit.

In addition, as reflected in the attached Technical Exhibit, as well as in the further technical statement of du Treil, Lundin and Rackley, Inc. that is appended to the attached interference agreement, the proposed WWME-LD facility will be constructed using the FCC's full-service digital mask described in Section 73.623(h) of the Commission's rules (as opposed to the FCC's "stringent" low power digital mask for which the station has been authorized), and thus will employ a digital mask with much stricter limitations on first-adjacent channel emissions. For this reason, as explained in the attached Technical Statement and also in the technical statement appended to the interference agreement, the proposed operation of WWME-LD will actually result in negligible (less than 0.5%) predicted interference to the Station W40BY facility. WWME-LD has also committed in the attached interference agreement with W40BY (in Section 2 of the agreement) to correct any actual interference in excess of 0.5% to W40BY, in the highly unlikely event that such interference to W40BY should result from the proposed WWME-LD operations.

Accordingly, it is submitted that the proposed operation of WWME-LD complies with the Commission's rules and policies and that a grant of this application would serve the public interest. To the extent that any waiver of Section 74.793(h) is deemed necessary to a grant of this application, such a waiver is respectfully requested for all of the reasons set forth above.
