

## EXHIBIT 2

The purpose of this exhibit is to demonstrate the Utah Arts Alliance's educational objective and that the proposed radio station will be used for the advancement of an educational program under 73.503(a) of the Rules. The rules describe that noncommercial licenses are not limited to classroom instruction, but may "transmit educational, cultural, and entertainment program to the general public," (Section 73.503(b)) in the advancement of a radio program. The following clearly demonstrates Utah Arts Alliance eligibility:

### EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE

The Utah Arts Alliance is a tax-exempt educational corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code (EIN: 74-3090585). The Utah Arts Alliance was founded in 2003 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Its mission is to foster the arts in all forms in order to create an aware, empowered, and connected community. Within its bylaws it states a purpose of "The Utah Arts Alliance is organized exclusively for charitable, scientific, and educational purposes, more specifically to promote culture and art." The Utah Arts Alliance's objective is well in-line with the qualification of being considered an educational nonprofit.

### PAST EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Since 2003, the Utah Arts Alliance has produced and presented a myriad of educational programming in its community throughout its existence. The Utah Arts Alliance has:

- Promoted art, diversity, and education in media,
- Presented classes and workshops in a variety of artistic disciplines (dance, music, visual arts, etc.),
- Collaborated with educational arts organizations,
- And provided educational opportunities to underserved populations.

### PROPOSED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

The Utah Arts Alliance intends to utilize the proposed facility to extend its educational mission to the airwaves by carrying:

- Public affairs programming dealing with art, environment, current affairs, science, and media education.
- A diversity of musical programming to encourage musicology.
- Debates, independent news, and issues of concern to the community.

The radio program will basically extend its current programming to fully actualize its original intent prescribed in its mission.
