

Hudson Valley Public Radio, Inc. ("Hudson Valley") proposes to provide a broad range of educational, cultural, news and public affairs programs of interest to a general audience in the proposed service area. The content of the proposed original programming will be determined by Hudson Valley's Board of Directors, based on ascertainment of local community leaders and listeners within the proposed service area.

Hudson Valley will provide a broad based educational and cultural programming schedule using both original programming for the service area and satellite programming. If granted, the proposed station will be used to promote educational programming in three primary ways:

1. The station will broadcast educational/informational programming using its own resources and utilizing the educational credentials of others. The proposed station will educate the community in a variety of subject fields, including (but not limited to) culture and the arts, community development, environmental concerns, human relations, issues of concern to women and minorities, governmental concerns, economic issues, health matters and senior citizen's issues.

2. The station will make airtime available for live broadcasts, teaching, information dissemination and interviews with experts in the areas described above, as well as other issues of concern to the community.

3. The station will offer community dialogue programming during which members of the public will be able to discuss issues of concern, including educational, social, governmental and human relations.

Hudson Valley will broadcast programming of instructional and general educational content in conjunction with area schools and educational programs.

Hudson Valley will comply with all content-related policies and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission.
