

Character Issues

On November 16, 2006, Roy William Mayhugh (“Mayhugh”) filed a Consolidated Petition to Deny the applications for renewal of licenses of KNET-LP, KSFV-LP, KNLA-LP, KHTV-LP, KSCZ-LP, KEBK-LP (FCC File Nos. BRTTL-20060810AKD, BRTTL-20060810AKE, BRTTL-20060810AMM, BRTTL-20060810AMP, BRTTL-20060810AJA, BRTTL-20060810AIN, respectively). The Petition contends that Venture Technologies Group, LLC (“VTG”), a member of the applicant herein, made false certifications and material misrepresentations to the Commission in connection with covering license applications for now-deleted LPTV stations K53IB and K59IB, Bakersfield, California, and through allegedly insufficient disclosures in response to Section II, Question 2b in the above renewal applications. VTG filed an Opposition on December 18, 2006. On April 13, 2007, the Enforcement Bureau of the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) released an Order adopting a Consent Decree in this matter, which concluded that there were no substantial and material questions of fact as to whether VTG possesses the basic qualifications, including those related to character, to hold or obtain any Commission license or authorization.
