Dear Mr. Davis:

This is in reference to the request filed on June 9, 2017. CCL requests a further extension of the STA granted on November 5, 2015, to continue to operate ND or with parameters at variance to allow time to file the required FCC Form 302 application.<sup>1</sup> In support of the request, CCL states that additional time is needed to complete the proof measurements and file the application to update all operating parameters.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for an extension of the STA IS HEREBY GRANTED, and CCL may continue to operate ND using tower #2 (ASRN 1003894) using a maximum of 1.25 kW

<sup>1</sup> WHYN(AM) is licensed for DA operation on 560 kHz with 5 kW day and 1 kW night.

(day) and 0.25 kW (night), or with DA parameters at variance using reduced power if needed to maintain monitor points within licensed tolerances. It will be necessary to further reduce or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. CCL must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.13 10. A request for one final short term extension must be filed on the date shown below (unless the new license had already been granted).

This authority expires on **January 12, 2018**.
