

**Request for STA to Remain Silent**

Susquehanna Radio Corp. ("Susquehanna"), acting pursuant to Sections 73.1635(a) and 73.1740(a)(4) of the Commission's rules, hereby requests a Special Temporary Authorization (an "STA") to discontinue operating stations KIKT(FM) ("KIKT") and KGVV(AM) ("KGVL") in Greenville, Texas, for a period of 180 days.

This request is necessitated by circumstances beyond Susquehanna's control. Susquehanna had entered into an Asset Purchase Agreement (the "Purchase Agreement"), dated as of June 1, 2009, with KGVV Radio LLC ("KGVL Radio") to sell KIKT and KGVV. The Purchase Agreement acknowledged that Susquehanna had a construction permit to relocate KIKT to Cooper, Texas (which was subsequently replaced with a new construction permit that expires on December 7, 2012). Simultaneous with the execution of the Purchase Agreement, Susquehanna and KGVV Radio entered into a Local Marketing Agreement (the "LMA") which required KGVV Radio to provide programming and certain other services for the operation of KIKT and KGVV.

The parties filed a Form 314 assignment application to secure Commission consent for the proposed assignment of KIKT and KGVV to KGVV Radio. File Nos. BAL-20090617ABC, ABD. A Petition to Deny the application was filed by Liberman Broadcasting of Dallas Licensing, LLC, and the Commission subsequently addressed two letters to Susquehanna and KGVV Radio requesting certain information with respect to the parties and the proposed transaction.

By letter dated May 30, 2010, KGVV Radio advised Susquehanna of its intention to terminate the Purchase Agreement. In that same letter, KGVV Radio advised Susquehanna that

it would terminate the LMA as well by June 30, 2010 unless Susquehanna agreed to increase the compensation being paid to KGVL Radio.

Susquehanna was unable to reach any agreement with KGVL Radio concerning a revision of the LMA, and, as of June 30, 2010, KGVL Radio no longer is providing any programming for KIKT or KGVL.

By letter dated June 24, 2010, KGVL Radio advised the Commission that it no longer wishes to pursue acquisition of KIKT and KGVL.

In light of KGVL Radio's actions, Susquehanna does not have the resources in place to continue operation of either station. Beyond that, Susquehanna would like to preserve its limited resources for use in the relocation of KIKT to Cooper, Texas. It does not make sense from a business or a public interest perspective for Susquehanna to expend those limited resources in trying to restore service for KIKT in Greenville when the station has to be relocated to Cooper, Texas.

Susquehanna is in the process of reviewing the situation to determine how and when it can implement the relocation of KIKT to Cooper and restore service for KIKT and KGVL. In the meantime, Susquehanna has no choice but to temporarily discontinue on-air operations of both stations.
