Dear Mr. Olender:

This concerns your February 12, 2010 letter filed on behalf of SATV10, LLC (SATV10) licensee of KTRG-TV, Del Rio, Texas, requesting that the expiration date for the digital television (DTV) construction permit (File No. BPCDT-19991101AEN) for the station be tolled. For the reasons set forth below, we grant your request and the toll the expiration of the station's digital construction permit.

The subject digital construction permit expires on February 17, 2010. You state that the station qualifies for tolling because its licensee is the subject to an ongoing bankruptcy proceeding. Accordingly, you request that the subject construction permit be tolled.

On June 13, 2009, the Commission began applying the tolling provisions of Section 73.3598 of the rules to DTV construction deadlines occurring after June 12, 2009. *See Implementation of DTV Delay Act, Second Report and Order and Order and Notice of Proposed Rulemaking*, FCC 09-11, released February 20, 2009. Section 73.3598 provides that a construction permit deadline may be tolled under specific circumstances such as acts of God or delays due to administrative or judicial review. The Commission has also determined that Section 73.3598(b)(2) would toll the construction deadline for a station that could not build because of a pending bankruptcy court action. Since the station's licensee is subject to an ongoing bankruptcy proceeding, and that proceeding has prevented construction of the station's digital facilities, we find that the station's DTV construction deadline should be tolled until completion of the bankruptcy proceedings.

The above facts considered, the tolling request IS GRANTED and the DTV construction deadline for KTRG-TV, Del Rio, Texas, IS TOLLED until six months from termination of the subject bankruptcy proceeding.
