Adverse Finding

Kent State University (“KSU”) previously disclosed the following matter (an adverse finding against KSU in a matter wholly unrelated to the operation of its radio stations) in the license renewal application for noncommercial educational station WKRW(FM), in FCC File No. BRED- 20040601BMU, granted September 20, 2004. Out of an abundance of caution, KSU hereby re-submits this information in this update to its pending modification application.

Dr. Dorothy Kovacevich, a former faculty member in KSU’s College of Education, filed a complaint in Federal District Court in March of 1995, alleging gender and age discrimination in violation of the Equal Pay Act (“EPA”), Title VII (gender and disparate impact) and the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (“ADEA”). In Kovacevich v. Kent State University, 224 F.3d 806 (6th Cir.) (Aug. 25, 2000), the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals affirmed a District Court judgment and damages in favor of Dr. Kovacevich on her ADEA claim, upheld a finding in favor of KSU on Title VII matters, and remanded the case for further proceedings on the EPA and other Title VII claims (on which KSU eventually prevailed).

KSU submits that this judgment does not in any way reflect adversely on its qualifications as a broadcast station licensee. The finding was based on actions that did not involve KSU’s broadcast stations or any FCC-licensed facility or FCC-regulated functions, nor employees of KSU that have any role in its operation of broadcast stations. As a large state institution of higher education, KSU is, from time to time, subject to adjudication that is wholly separate from its broadcast operations and FCC qualifications. Accordingly, KSU believes that these matters have no bearing on its stewardship of its broadcast stations.
