**Nature of Transaction and Assignee**

Nevada Public Radio, the proposed assignee of noncommercial educational radio station KJIV(FM), has previously been granted broadcast applications by the Federal Communications Commission that found it qualified as a noncommercial educational entity with a qualifying educational program. Upon assignment, Nevada Public Radio will use KJIV to advance a program similar to that the FCC has found qualifying in connection with its other NCE-licensed radio stations.

As detailed in exhibit 16 to this application, Nevada Public Radio is presently the licensee of seven noncommercial educational radio stations (KNPR, KCVN, KTPH, KLNK, KWPR, KSGU, and KLKR). Nevada Public Radio's stated mission is to enhance the quality of life and foster civic engagement by informing, educating and inspiring its growing audiences. Nevada Public Radio seeks to be recognized as the leading independent source of information and cultural expression and a catalyst for civic engagement. Nevada Public Radio was established in 1975 as an independent, not-for-profit, public benefit corporation. It first signed on the air in 1980, serving the Las Vegas area with Nevada's first National Public Radio affiliate station.

Nevada Public Radio certifies that it is a non-profit entity, that its governing documents permit its advancement of an educational program, and that there is no provision in any of those documents that would restrict it from advancing an educational program or complying with any FCC rule, policy, or provision of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

As the long-time licensee of several existing NCE radio stations, Nevada Public Radio has clearly demonstrated its commitment to, and capability of, providing educational broadcast programming. Nevada Public Radio will continue to ensure that high quality public radio is available to its existing and proposed service areas. Nevada Public Radio plans to continue to provide a wide range of news, public affairs, and noncommercial informational and entertainment programming to address issues of concern and interest to residents of its listening areas.
