EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE, EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM, and ESTABLISHED LOCAL APPLICANT

OZCAT ENTERTAINMENT, INC.

The purpose of this exhibit is to demonstrate Ozcat Entertainment Inc. educational objective and that the proposed radio station will be used for the advancement of an educational program under 73.503(a) of the Rules. The rules describe that non-commercial licenses are not limited to classroom instruction but may transmit educational, cultural and entertainment program to the general public, (section 73.503(b)) in the advancement of a radio program. The following clearly demonstrates Ozcat Entertainment, Inc.'s eligibility.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE:

Ozcat Entertainment, Inc. (OEI) is a non-profit educational corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code. **OEI as an entity began operations on Mare Island in Vallejo, CA in April of 2005.** The OEI articles of incorporation, filed in the State of California, state, "We will educate local and independent artists and technicians by giving them opportunities to learn the ropes of the music business such as radio interviews, studio time in our Audio/video production studios, and by teaching them how to promote themselves via computers/internet." Furthermore, within its articles of incorporation, OEI states its mission is to: to prepare and promote local artists and technicians in the field of popular entertainment, to promote and chronicle Vallejo's entertainment heritage and history, and to support and network with with other local non-profits.

PAST EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND EVENTS THAT OZCAT HAS PUT FORTH OR BEEN INVOLVED WITH:

- Ozcat has grown into a diverse group of talented volunteers who are getting hands-on experience working in the field of arts and entertainment.
- Ozcat has used its website to highlight the work of local artists via interviews, live performances and website links with the goal of creating a comprehensive web presence for our community. We hope to showcase our community's unique brand of cultural diversity to the rest of the world.
- Ozcat has networked with other community non-profits to highlight their programming and events on our online website and community calendars
- Ozcat has hosted community events and presentations at our facilities. Past events have included: National Neighborhood Night Out where we partnered with local law enforcement and hosted a neighborhood block party at our facility with informative speakers and open forum discussion about community safety.
- Ozcat has participated as an organization in community awareness events such as California Coastal Clean-up Day, the Cancer Society Relay for Life and voter registration drive

- The Ozcat building has been available for local artists to teach classes and educational seminars such as master drum classes
- The Ozcat facility has been used for video and film shoots by local filmmakers
- Ozcat has partnered with Vallejo's community access television station to create educational programs about local arts and entertainment.
- The Ozcat Facility has been used for band practices and rehearsals, showcase gigs and live performance events where our volunteers get hands-on educational experience in sound engineering and event production.

PROPOSED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM:

Ozcat Entertainment intends to utilize the proposed facility to expand our mission to the airwaves by using the radio to broadcast:

- Community affairs programming dealing with art and entertainment, non-profit organizations and events, guest speakers from the community
- Local music programming, live interviews and performances by local artists
- Debates, independent news and issues of concern to our community

OZCAT ENTERTAINMENT HAS BEEN A VIABLE VALLEJO PRESENCE SINCE SPRING OF 2005

Ozcat Entertainment staked its presence in Vallejo, California in the Spring of 2005. David Martin, Kathleen Martinelli and Amatullah Carter wanted to bring their expertise in musical production and development to the area to promote and build the local arts community. The keystone of the enterprise was to eventually create a community radio station

Ozcat began renting a facility on Mare Island in Vallejo, California from The Boys Under the Hood, a local classic car club. See EXHIBIT 2B, Page 2. They began to focus on artist development & education with local artists such as the Urban Bushmen Raz B, and Anitra Sharon who used the facilities to rehearse bands, choreography and audio and video production work.

In November of 2006, they moved into a new building at 1100 Georgia Street, nearby the "entertainment district" of downtown Vallejo, California that had been purchased purchased by David S. Martin and Kathleen E. Martinelli for the express purpose of housing Ozcat Entertainment.

The 4,000 sq. ft. facility has been remodeled to provide space for performance and rehearsals, multiple production studios, office space as well as computer lab and common areas. The studio has become a center for local musicians and artists to gather and collaborate.
