This application arises from unique circumstances that the parties believe make filing and approval on Form 316 appropriate. WBSC-TV, formerly WFBC-TV, is licensed to Anderson (WFBC-TV) Licensee, Inc., a subsidiary of Glencairn, Ltd. By Order FCC 01-336, released December 10, 2001, the Commission approved the transfer of control of Glencairn from Edwin L. Edwards, Sr., to Carolyn C. Smith pursuant to a Stock Redemption Agreement by which Edwards' ownership of Glencairn's controlling shares will be retired and Smith will hold all issued and outstanding voting stock. The agreements concerning this transfer of control are on file at the Commission in File Nos. BTCCT-19991116BEC/BEE, which the Order granted. These two applications were for transfer of control of Glencairn stations WNUV(TV), Baltimore, MD, and WTTE(TV), Columbus, Ohio, respectively.

In the same Order, the Commission dismissed an application for assignment of license of WBSC-TV, File No. BTCCT-19991116BDP. The result of that dismissal is that Glencairn continues to control the station. However, because of the application to assign the station to a new licensee, a separate application to transfer control of Glencairn's WBSC-TV along with its WNUV(TV) and WTTE(TV) was not filed or granted in the Order. Consequently, while the transfer of control of Glencairn will include all three stations, specific approval has been obtained only for two. However, since the Commission recently has thoroughly reviewed and approved the exact same transaction with respect to both the WNUV(TV) and WTTE(TV) long form applications, approval of the transfer of WBSC-TV on the same grounds at this time is ministerial. Because the dismissal of the WBSC-TV assignment application left a gap in authorizing the transfer of control of that station, and the transaction has been so recently approved in two long form applications, authorizing the transfer of WBSC-TV on a short form so that all three Glencairn stations will be transferred concurrently, as they necessarily must be, is logical and serves the public interest in avoiding pointless administrative burdens.
