Exhibit 2: Special Operating Conditions

On July 28, 2009, the Commission granted the above-cited application of Channel 20 TV Company ("CTTC") for a modification of the construction permit for KCDO-TV with the special operating condition that KCDO-TV take steps necessary to restore service to persons who resided within the Grade B contour of the station's analog facility and are not predicted to receive service from the authorized digital facility. The condition may be met by entering into long-term retransmission agreements with existing television translator stations or by translators licensed to CTTC.

On January 6, 2010, the Commission granted two applications for Replacement Digital Television Translators: BDRTCDT-20091223ANC at Sidney, Nebraska and BDRTCDT-20091223AMZ at Kimball, Nebraska. CTTC has obtained site leases for the two translators. Some of the equipment for the Kimball facility already exists at KCDO-TV's reduced-power operation and is being moved following the commencement of service of KCDO-TV's full-power facility. Upon delivery of the remaining equipment, these translators will be placed in operation.

Meanwhile, on December 17, the "Region 1" government-owned translator system began broadcasting KCDO-TV from its stations in the following locations: Yuma, Idalia, Wray, Holyoke, Julesburg, Pleasant Valley, Sterling, and Peetz. Region 1 will add the station to translators at Anton and Akron within the next two weeks.

The combined coverage area of the translators is depicted on the attached map. Together these facilities cover 98.3% of the population in KCDO-TV's analog loss area.

Accordingly, CTTC is meeting the conditions that the Commission placed on the grant of its construction permit.
