The Affiliated Media Foundation Movement, Inc. (AM/FM) was incorporated as a non-profit entity and registered in Louisiana on May 15, 1978. AM/FM produces radio news, public affairs, and programming serving the needs and interests of low and moderate income Americans. We cover social justice topics such as immigrant rights, health care reform, ending foreclosures, workers' rights, community development, sustainable environment, neighborhood safety awareness, and improving public education. AM/FM is a platform for voices not commonly heard in the mainstream media living in all parts of the United States. Each week we produce several newscasts comprised of interviews, essays and short feature-length pieces that provide an in-depth look at a particular topic.

Our educational mission for an LPFM station includes all of the above, with an emphasis on such topics as they relate to the New Orleans area, and especially the 9th ward of the city where the studio and tower will be located. Additionally, community news, views, and local cultural content (music, literature) will be broadcast. We will convey the perspectives of New Orleanians from any and all backgrounds, with an emphasis on informing listeners about topics that are otherwise underreported. Examples include:

- Multilingual newscasts and instructional broadcasts in Spanish, Vietnamese, etc.
- Local history and storytelling programs
- Urban agriculture, locavore, and sustainable living information and awareness
- Instructional craft and DIY shows
- Programming for children with local school and youth news
- Interviews with community organizations and local government officials and remote broadcasts if possible.

We wish to allow our community members to participate fully in the process of local media. Furthermore, we will advance the educational goal of enabling citizen journalism by opening broadcast production opportunities and training to the entire community.
