


STATEMENT OF WHY Y, INC.

WHYY, Inc. ("WHYY"), licensee of non-commercial television station WHYY-TV, Wilmington, Delaware, is providing this statement to be submitted with the application ("Application") for special temporary authority filed by American Broadcasting Companies, Inc. ("ABC"), licensee of WABC-TV, New York, New York ("WABC"), to enable the Metropolitan Television Alliance ("MTVA") to install a temporary test panel type antenna on the One World Trade Center complex in Lower Manhattan ("1WTC") in order to evaluate whether VHF signal reception might be improved by relocating the facilities of WABC-TV, channel 7; WPIX(DT), channel 11 and WNET, channel 13 (collectively, the "NYC VHF Stations"), to One World Trade Center. As described in the Application, MTVA and the NYC VHF Stations intend initially to collect measurements while the test antenna is positioned at 29 degrees True. WHYY understands and acknowledges that, depending upon the initial measurement results obtained, MTVA and the NYC VHF Stations may determine that it will be beneficial to reposition the test antenna from (a) 29 degrees True to (b) 60 and/or 0 degrees True in order to support the collection of data in Queens and the Bronx, respectively. WHYY further understands and acknowledges that, if the test antenna is repositioned to 0 degrees True, it is predicted to cause interference to WHYY-TV in excess of 0.5%. In the event that it does, in fact, become necessary for MTVA and the NYC VHF Stations to orient the test antenna to 0 degrees True, WHYY acknowledges that such orientation is predicted to result in 4.87635% new interference to WHYY-TV, and WHYY hereby consents and agrees to accept such interference during the test period. WHYY's acquiescence to accepting possible new interference during the test period in no way indicates or should be interpreted as WHYY's acquiescence to accepting possible new interference for a period beyond the test period described above. WHYY understands that the tests will be conducted during the overnight hours for a duration of no more than two weeks. WHYY will be notified at least five days prior to the beginning of the test period.
