THERE'S NO PLACE IN CNY MORE ITALIAN THAN **SOLVAY**
A **VILLAGE** PROUD OF ITS ITALIAN HERITAGE TRIES TO MAINTAIN TRADITIONS OF AN
AGING GENERATION

As a young girl in the late 1960s, Joni Burrows felt sorry for the residents of **Solvay** .

"The only time I'd ever come to **Solvay** , I'd be on Milton Avenue and I'd think, "Those poor people in **Solvay** '," she recalled.

At 16, she met her future husband, Bob Salvagni (pronounced: sal-VAH-nee), and her impression of **Solvay** changed. Rather than seeing only the smokestacks from **Solvay** Process, she got a better sense of the **village** as she visited with his large Italian family.

Still, her friends and families were not convinced.

"They warned me. They said, "Don't marry him. You'll end up in **Solvay** and never leave," she said.

After 31 years of married life in **Solvay**, Joni Salvagni, now 50, said her friends were right.

"But," she added, "I love it here."

Part of the draw to the village, then and now, is that it is the most Italian place in the Central New York region. According to the 2000 U.S. Census, 34.67 percent of the 6,847 village residents identified themselves as Italians.

The population of Italian-Americans in **Solvay** remained roughly the same from 1990 to 2000, but by all accounts was much higher from the early 1900s to the 1960s.

In 1980, the first year for which the Census kept ethnic breakdowns, the percentage of Italians was 45 percent.

"I would say it (**Solvay**) lost some Italian-ness, but it is still very Italian, more so than anywhere else you go," said Amy Francemone, 35, a lifelong resident.

The village is at a crossroads as it struggles to maintain the traditions and heritage that have defined it since the early 1900s, while older generations with strong ties to the culture die and some younger residents move away for better job opportunities.

"We moved to Lakeland and we are probably the farthest anyone (of the family) has moved yet," said Vincent Aldo Salvagni, 28, Bob and Joni's son. He and his wife Barbara, also a **Solvay** High alumnus, have a toddler daughter Hannah. "I couldn't go any further. I wouldn't want to go anywhere where I couldn't get here with a short drive for Sunday dinner."

Families who immigrated from small towns in Italy have lived generations as neighbors, with children buying their parents' homes, creating a closeness that's hard to duplicate.

"Over the generations, they begin to feel more like cousins or paisans," Francemone said. "You know more about them than some family members."

It's that closeness that draws families to stay nearby, or join village activities even after moving away.

"If you live outside the village but grew up in the **village**, you still consider yourself a **Solvay**-ite," said Mike Tanzella, 37, of Camillus, whose family owned Tanzella Grocery, a small mom-and-pop store until it closed in 2004.

An ethnic flair

Solvay became so heavily Italian because of **Solvay** Process, which began making soda ash in 1884.

The factory employed many Italians, but needed more workers. Employees wrote to relatives in Italy or Austria, drawing them to **Solvay**.

And unlike some other large Central New York factories, which either closed or moved to the suburbs much earlier, **Solvay** Process (as Allied Chemical) remained open until 1985.

"That may have slowed the process of the ethnic group moving out and dispersing into the suburbs," said Dennis Connors, curator at the Onondaga Historical Association.

It was during the 1950s and 1960s that **Solvay** developed its reputation as never having "For Sale" signs in front of homes.

"You could never find a home in **Solvay**," said Mayor Anthony Modafferi, 56, a lifelong resident. "It never lasted long enough to have a Realtor; most were sold

between relatives or friends. That's how I got my first home, from my grandmother."

In 1929, the Tyrolean men of the village formed the Tyrol Club to promote the culture of people from the Trentino-Tyrol region, which was part of Austria until 1918, when it became part of Italy.

It remains a cultural influence in the village through its polenta dinners, cooking classes, and opportunities for residents to speak Italian.

Connors said it is good for the village to retain its ethnic flair and use its Italian heritage as a drawing point.

"Ethnic authenticity has an attraction to it. **Solvay** could try to use that," Connors said. "Suddenly people have started sort of rediscovering ethnic enclaves as an alternative to homogeneous areas that we have created in a lot of America."

Simmering traditions

There's still no shortage of people clamoring to buy a ticket to the Tyrol Club's most popular event - monthly polenta dinners.

The cornmeal-based dinner is made the old-fashioned way: churned with a "trisa," a long wooden blade, in a waist-deep copper tub.

The club has 230 members, (who must be men of Tyrol heritage), 200 auxiliary members and 150 social members, but it finds itself aging. Club president Robert Cazzolli, 55, says he's on the younger end.

"It's not the social focus it once was," he said.

Traditions related to food still simmer in the village. Sausage and peppers are no longer a common sight hanging in basement windows, but new neighbors may still be greeted with homemade wine, cheese or roasted peppers.

"If you do something nice for someone, the best thing is to get a bottle of homemade wine," said Arnie Gozzi, 70.

Cooking classes generate interest among those looking to learn how to make traditional homemade favorites, like gnocchi and risotto.

"People come to it. Maybe it's something their parents used to make and they never learned," said Cazzolli.

Younger residents often aren't familiar enough with the language to use it regularly. But when the **Solvay** Union Free School District did not offer Italian to incoming seventh-graders in 2002, the uproar was so strong that the courses were reinstated.

The **village's** three-day **Solvay** Festival grew out of the Feast of the Assumption, which used to draw hundreds for a procession.

Organizer Tony Alberti said he tries to make the festival reflect the village's heritage with an Italian band, an Italian comedian and the Tyrol Club selling polenta.

"This village has good roots. It has a lot of good memories," Alberti said. "We have to make our own now; that's what we are going to do with the field days."

Village residents and leaders said they wouldn't speculate if the Italian population in **Solvay** will drop by the next census.

What they do contend is that the Italian fabric of the **village** will continue to define **Solvay** for quite some time.

"**Solvay** as a whole is tight. It always has been," Cazzolli said. "We say there are two types of people - either you're from **Solvay** or you want to be."

Sunday means family dinner

Everyone brings a dish to the gathering of the Salvagni family for Sunday dinner in **Solvay**.

The buffet could include traditional Italian and Tyrolean favorites like gnocchi, bracirole, cavetelli, stuffed shells and canolis. And then there's always pasta in homemade sauce with meatballs.

"Some of the most wonderful times that we've shared in our lives have been with family around the table," said Bob Salvagni.

Aldo, 79, and his wife Ann both were born and raised in **Solvay**. Married since 1948, the couple now lives in a house her parents once owned.

Three of their four children still live in **Solvay**. Daughter Diana Hunter is not far away, in Onondaga Hill. Bob Salvagni lives in the house his parents and grandparents once owned, and his neighbor across the street is his sister, Donna Blanchard. A few blocks away, Mark Salvagni lives in a house his nephew once owned.

Counting Aldo, Ann and their children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, many of whom still live in **Solvay**, about 30 people regularly gather for family functions.

In their own words

In their own words

Many dialects: "As far as the Italian reputation goes, it will always stick. There's still a good percentage of Italians in **Solvay**.

"It used to be that there were so many different dialects around the neighborhoods. With the younger people, there's a percentage that don't have a feel for the Italian language.

"Three out of four of my grandparents came from the old country. I can remember how they used to speak. I've always regretted that I never picked it up. I can pick up a word or so, but I would have really loved to learn to speak it."

Good neighbors: "It was a great place to grow up and remains a great place to live.

"When I was young, we never wanted to get in trouble. There were so many people who knew you and your family; your parents would know what you did before you even got home.

"I could literally walk from the west end to the east end and tell you at least one person who lived on every block we passed. How do you duplicate something like that?"

John D'Eredita, resident and sergeant in Sheriff's Department

Plenty of polenta: "Food is what it always comes back to. It's the only place around that everyone knows what polenta is.

"I thought everywhere was like this. But when I went to Connecticut for a year, I couldn't find any good food out there, not even pizza.

"My friends didn't even know what pasta e fagioli was. My mom would make it, freeze it and express mail it, so that it was just beginning to melt when it arrived. My friends loved it but they said it gave them heartburn. I had to say, no, it's "agita."'

Wine and sausages: "At one time it seemed the whole neighborhood was Italian.

"Everyone made wine in the basement. There were always carafes of wine in the cellar. My brother and I would get a long pipe and squeeze the grapes. We'd have fruit flies in the house for months after that. Around Christmas time, we would go and pass out bottles of wine around the neighborhood.

"You'd always see sausages hanging in the basement, and the peppers, too.

"Everyone would have a garden in their backyard. Those gardens were something. And the tomatoes were out of sight."







Solvay Bank prospers with focus on small biz

SOLVAY - **Solvay Bank** President and CEO Paul P. Mello says since the bank's establishment in 1917 it has always targeted small local businesses - one factor that he attributes to the community bank's success.

"Our focus has always been on small businesses," Mello says. "We're a **community bank**, a small-business **bank**."

Mello projects another successful year for 2007 with growth in earnings, assets, and loans.

Solvay Bank Corp., (OTC BB: SOBS.OB) holding company for **Solvay Bank**, earned \$5 million in 2006 and this year Mello projects the company to earn \$5.2 million. On Oct. 26, the bank issued its third-quarter earnings report, showing \$3.8 million in net income through the first nine months of the year. That was up 2.9 percent over the same period in 2006.

The CEO projects the bank's total assets to surpass \$500 million by year's-end, up from \$471.7 million at the end of 2006. **Solvay Bank's** total assets stood at \$497.5 million as of Sept. 30, 2007, according to its earnings report.

Mello says the bank's total loans should exceed \$350 million by year's end, up from \$336.7 million in 2006. Total loans increased to an all-time high of \$349.6 million at the end of the third quarter, up \$17.6 million or 5.3 percent from the prior year, according to its earnings report.

Solvay Bank's office at 1537 Milton Ave. in the **village** of **Solvay** is the bank's headquarters. The 30,000-square-foot building is used as both a bank branch and administrative offices.

Solvay Bank's business-banking products include commercial and real-estate loans, Small Business Administration loan programs, checking and savings accounts, mer-

chant credit-cards ervices, and online cash-management services.

Mello says a total of 145 employees work at the state-chartered community bank, with about 100 employees at the Milton Avenue headquarters.

Other branches are located in Camillus, Fairmont, Salina,

North Syracuse, downtown Syracuse, and Westvale. The newest branch, located in Salina, opened two years ago.

In 1979, **Solvay** Bank expanded out of its main office and opened the first satellite office in Westvale.

"We were one of the few then to put a bank in stores where people shop," Mello says.

Along with the Salina branch opening, in the past few years Mello says **Solvay** Bank has worked to broaden its range of products for clients. In 2003, **Solvay** Bank launched a full-service insurance agency, **Solvay** Bank Insurance Agency, Inc., a subsidiary of **Solvay** Bank.

Mello says **Solvay** Bank has also revamped its trust and investment services including investment-management services that assist individuals in making investment goals. **Solvay** Bank also offers both wills and living trusts.

"Even though we're considered a small bank for consumers, we have a full suite of products and a full technology base [for small businesses]," Mello says.

Although **Solvay** Bank competes with large banks such as JPMorgan Chase and Bank of America, Mello says he doesn't view them as competitors. Mello considers the size of **Solvay** Bank an advantage because its employees have the ability to form close relationships with the community and can adjust rates based on the local economy.

"We only have to go as far as here [**Solvay's** main office] to make a decision. I think that gives us an edge," Mello says.

Description

General dentistry is the field of dentistry focused preventing, evaluating, diagnosing, and treating diseases of the mouth cavity (mouth, teeth and gums), as well as maintaining the functionality and esthetics of the teeth and associated tissues, structures, and jaw.

A general dentist is a dentist who prevents, evaluates, diagnoses, and treats diseases of the oral cavity and related structures. A general dentist can prescribe drugs, x-rays and devices. Because some oral diseases and abnormalities can indicate other health issues, a general dentist may refer patients to their physician or a specialist for further evaluation or treatment. Most general dentists perform restorative, prosthetic, routine endodontic therapy, routine periodontal therapy, and simple dental extractions (exodontia). Many general dentists can treat more complex cases, place implants, and surgically extract third molars (wisdom teeth).

General dentistry is a recognized American Dental Association specialty of dentistry. General dentists must complete at least four years of postgraduate study and generally two years of clinical experience.

Diseases / Illnesses Treated

Physicians in this specialty treat patients suffering from numerous diseases and illnesses, but some of the most



- The Solvay Police Department has a rich tradition of providing law enforcement service to the citizens of the Village of Solvay; a history that spans over 100 years.

- The Department currently has a Police Chief, three Sergeants, one Detective, seven full time Police Officers, four part time Police Officers and three civilian employees. The Department is the primary law enforcement agency that patrols the 1.56 square miles or over twenty six miles of roadway that encompasses the village. The Officers respond to an average of 8,100 calls for service annually which range from non-criminal incidents to major incidents including burglary, robbery, or assault complaints.

- The Department has several Officers trained as criminal evidence technicians, one accident investigation technician, one [DARE](#) officer, two firearms instructors, two NYS certified police instructors, five [bicycle patrol officers](#) and one part time crime prevention officer. All Officers are required to attend forty plus hours of in-service training annually, in addition to various professional development courses throughout the year. The Chief is a New York State certified police instructor and holds the title of Master Instructor .

- Officers are utilizing the latest in equipment to better help them perform their duties. Each Officer carries the Glock .45 caliber semi-automatic handgun and have the option of taking an 870 Remington 12 gauge shotgun on patrol. The

patrol fleet is comprised of four marked Crown Victoria police cruisers, one four-wheel-drive Jeep Cherokee and two unmarked vehicles. The fleet ranges in age from 1999 to 2004. Each of the patrol vehicles is equipped with a mobile computer terminal. The department recently purchased three new personal computers, four new laptop computers and six new Motorola HT1000 portable radios.

- The Department is committed to providing a professional level of service that includes a commitment to customer service and attention to quality of life issues. We are continuously working with the citizens of the village on various community relations projects. Projects such as a neighborhood watch program that is currently a role model for communities in the area, and a very strong and active police explorer post.
- The Solvay Police Department has provided over 100 years of dedicated law enforcement service to the community. As we enter into our second 100 years, we are committed to offer this level of excellence to the citizens of the Village of Solvay.

Today, D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance and Education) reaches approximately 25 million American students per year in kindergarten through 12th grade in over 250,000 classrooms. It also teaches them how to resist unwanted peer pressure and to build and maintain self-confidence. With D.A.R.E. officers salaries paid by local law enforcement agencies, the total cost of D.A.R.E. for one child, from kindergarten through 12th grade, is just over \$12. This compares to \$40,000 per year for incarceration. We then spend \$800 a day and up on treatment programs, increasing costs exponentially. And in a society where over 23 million Americans use illegal drugs, prevention far outweighs the costly alternative.

The D.A.R.E. program is alive and well in the Village of Solvay. The program is directed at the younger members of our community. Officer Ascoti teaches the D.A.R.E. Program in our elementary and middle schools. Officer Ascoti also attends school functions and provides a tremendous resource for the schools.

D.A.R.E. offers an innovative approach to substance abuse prevention that has been both well-received and easily adapted. This drug resistance program effectively addresses yet another form of child exploitation - victimization through substance abuse.

Cop Saves Man Attacked by Razor Wielder

Suddenly crazed while walking in Milton av., Solvay, Joseph Camacho of S. Townsend st. attacked John Foley, 2107 Milton av., Solvay, with a razor and was prevented from seriously slashing Foley only by the proximity of Patrolman Matthew Scanlon.

Patrolman Scanlon, who was sitting in Foley's automobile when the attack occurred, jumped out of the car and grabbed Camacho, but not until the razor wielder had slashed Foley's overcoat.

Camacho and Foley are strangers, but it is believed the former became suddenly crazed and whipped

out a razor and tried to slash the first man he encountered.

Foley probably owes his life to the fact that Patrolman Scanlon, a friend, was sitting in the machine.

The officer saw Camacho when he lunged at Foley, a razor in his right hand, but could not get out of the machine in time to prevent the attack. Camacho was slashing away at Foley's back when Patrolman Scanlon grabbed him.

Disarming Camacho, Patrolman Scanlon took him to police headquarters, where he is being held on an open charge. He is held under \$2,000 bail.

Camacho will be arraigned before Judge A. D. Ginnely of Solvay Thursday.

A Legacy of Libraries: **Solvay** Public Library

The **Solvay** Public library is the last general collection Carnegie library in Onondaga County.

The library was funded, in part, with a \$10,000 Carnegie grant. A matching grant came from **Solvay** Process Co.

From a vantage point on Woods Road, the façade of the yellow brick building looks much as it did when it opened its doors in 1905. Dramatic steps topped by pillars lead to a heavy carved oak entrance door.

But inside, the library is completing a transformation that marries the past with the future. At the rear of the 6,266-square-foot original building is a newly built 5,500-square-foot addition designed by JCM Architectural Associates, of Syracuse. The improvements, called the Centennial Project, started in 2000.

In addition to increased collection space to hold the library's roughly 31,448 items and eight public computers, there is updated access for people with disabilities and additional parking.

Inga Henrickson Barnello, vice president of the library's board of trustees, says renovation funds were raised, in part, from a \$2.25 million **Solvay village** bond and roughly \$800,000 in grants, and corporate and individual donations. The library's trustees are still gathering donations and plan to announce a large gift, Barnello says. The entire project is expected to come in at roughly \$3.2 million.

The new library also includes a larger circulation desk, a computer lab, staff work space, a kitchen for the community room, more stack space, a small meeting room and new bathrooms. A larger **Solvay** Process archive room, containing historic local materials related to the plant and village, is another update. GROUP'S FOUNDING MOTHERS HELPED BUILD CENTER

DICK CASE NEIGHBORHOODS

"When our children got involved, we went along," Peg Wells is saying. Fifty years later, she's still there.

In 1956, seven mothers who lived in the **village** of **Solvay** started an auxiliary to the **Solvay** Tigers Athletic Club begun nearly 30 years before by their husbands, fathers and brothers. The Tigers - then and now - provide the young people of the town of Geddes village with a way to play sports.

The women's commitment is big-time and long-standing. They helped "the men" - the original Tigers - plan, finance and build **Solvay**-Geddes Community Youth Center on Woods Road, next to the **Solvay village** offices. The building, including a large gym and swimming pool, was dedicated in 1964.

"We built this for **Solvay**," Peg explains as we tour the center this week. "No grants, no government help, just hard work."

And, from everything I saw and heard the other day, truly a "community center." **Solvay** and Geddes citizens - kids to seniors - give this sprawling brick complex a workout every day of the week.

Peg is one of two surviving founders of the Tigers auxiliary. Sunday, members will be toasted during a 50th anniversary celebration at the center, noon to 4 p.m.

The other founders were Alice Prell, Palma Masterpole, Nancy Baichi, Tillie Montreal, Mary Pirro and Helen Zajac.

Peg's a retired BOCES accountant and president of **Solvay** Library who was drawn into the Tigers in 1956 by her three children wanting to play sports. The Tigers founders had started their athletic program so that **Solvay** youngsters would have a place to play football.

Peg, a grandmother, saw her own kids "grow up and move away" while she stayed as a

volunteer in her adopted hometown.

"I've been working with youth since 1956," she says. "I'm still here."

Anne Marie Masterpole joins us. She's a former auxiliary officer and **Solvay** native who knew the Tigers as "a family thing, a household word." Yes, her children became Tigers. Husband Michael was already there; child and adult. His mother, Palma Masterpole, was an auxiliary founder; father Michael Sr. was the Tigers' first athletic director.

Anne Marie points to one of The backboards in the gym.

"My husband was a welder at The Process when the building went up. He helped weld the framework on the backboards. The company was good to us."

The Process - once **Solvay** Process, later Allied Chemical - was a **Solvay** fixture, and benefactor, nearly a century before Allied closed the works. A company officer, Carl Sessano, is honored with a bronze plaque in the center lobby. The Process donated the land for the building.

Peg and Anne Marie fill me in on how the auxiliary and the athletic club dug in to raise the money they needed to build and equip the center. The women ran card parties, spaghetti suppers, Stanley parties, fashion shows, bake sales and toy parties.

"We sold everything," Peg recalls, including dollar bottles of vanilla to buy a large coffee maker.

These **Solvay** moms and dads started weekly bingo games that continue, a major source of income for the center and its programs. For 30 years, they had a food stand at the state fair where "even the tips went into the till," according to Anne Marie.

When we get to the center's large and well-armed kitchen, Peg points out that she and auxiliary colleagues - now grown to 100 - donated and cooked enough food these 50 years to feed a small country. The auxiliary provides seven "bingo teams" to cook for the Saturday night event. Whenever a dinner is prepared, it's likely to be **Solvay's** municipal chow, spaghetti and meatballs.

Len Pfeiffer, the center's director, and Mike Gesapo, the veteran Tigers coach, arrive with a new batch of historic pictures, for the "Memory Lane" Peg and Anne Marie worked up for Sunday. Mike recalls the generations of **Solvay** kids he raised coaching "biddy basketball," the game for little guys. Len, a son of **Solvay**, started playing here right after the center opened.

Len says the center provides free programs for between 1,200 and 1,300 youngsters, as well as more than 600 adults, some of them on paid or corporate memberships. The programs include monthly youth dances, after-school sports, crafts and Hal-

loween and Christmas parties.

The center is a polling place and a place to stay fit - seniors voted and splashed in the pool the day of my visit. The workout and weight rooms are favorites these days. **Solvay** High School athletes use the center for workouts, too.

"This is a community center to serve the needs of all the residents of **Solvay** and Geddes," according to Len. He has a staff of 12, most of them part time. Besides money raised by the Tigers and the auxiliary, support comes from town and village budgets.


