On 7/20/13 we attempted to construct the CP. Our plan was to re-broadcast K205EB. We used a Scala CLFM-RX receive antenna with a Sony digital FM receiver to try to locate K205EB. After 1/2 a day of trying different antenna locations, we were unsuccessful. 88.9 is completely covered at the site elevation by KOPO-LP in Paia, HI. We also tried to receive other CSN translators on Oahu and Hawaii (Big Island) without success.
