

XRAY.fm hosts a diverse lineup of original and syndicated educational talk and music programming that serves the community of Portland, Oregon and our greater community of listeners online at xray.fm. Below is a list of just 15 of the programs we have been airing in 2017, thirteen of which are produced in house. programming (2017).

1. City Club of Portland Friday Forums (Fridays Noon to 1:30)

For decades, the City Club Friday Forum has been Portland's leading lunchtime speaking series -- serving as the venue for the Governor's State of the State and the Mayor's State of the City, for example. For 40 years, recordings aired on KOPB, Portland's NPR affiliate. Starting this year, XRAY has become the radio partner for the City Club, delivering a live broadcast of discussions on local and national issues.



2. **XRAY in the Morning** is our flagship education and public affairs program, including regular conversations with professors from local colleges **Portland State University, Reed College, Lewis and Clark College**, speakers with **TEDxMt.Hood**, authors visiting **Powell's Books**, as well as conversations with prominent politicians such as the Governor and Secretary of State.



3. **Oh My Dollar!** gives [personal finance advice](#) from Lillian's youthful perspective.



4. **Everything is Interesting** looks at science and technology with Keera and Kira.



5. **Minority Retort** [highlights artists](#) every Friday among communities of color, led by Jason.



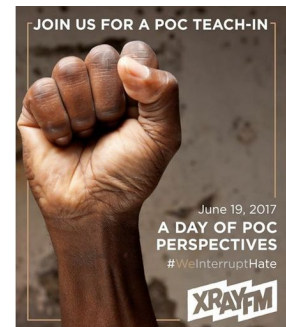
6. Group Therapy is a twice-weekly roundtable discussion on local current events. Recent topics include gender equality and gender-based violence, ableism, mass incarceration, and transportation. The show engages the community by including listener calls and text messages into the conversation and is entirely produced in house by volunteers.



7. Grow PDX: Hosted by Oregon State University Professor Weston Miller, this live call-in show focused on Oregon-focused gardening and horticulture and includes a weekly featured guest.



8. "We Interrupt Hate" Juneteenth Teach In, Special Programming June 19th, 2017: Juneteenth commemorates the day slavery was abolished on June 19th 1865. "We Interrupt Hate" interrupted normal programming from 6am-6pm on June 19th 2017 and featured conversations with local POC leaders on the history of racism in our state, what it means to be a person of color in the one of America's whitest cities, how to organize against oppression and hate and what it means to be an effective ally.



9. Radio Survivor is a weekly show that explores the future of radio that matters, with a focus on community, college and low-power FM, along with podcasting and internet radio.



10. The Future of What, hosted by the President of record label Kill Rock Stars, FOW features conversations with musicians and allies about the future of the music industry.



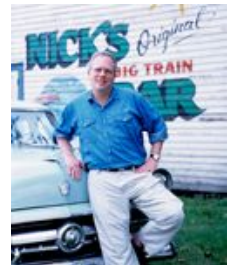
11. PDX Pop Now! weekly radio show hosted by local non profit organization PDX Pop Now!, this show focuses on music from the Portland area, as well as putting an emphasis on all ages bands and genres that receive less attention from the media.



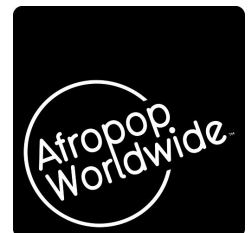
12. Adventures of Encyclopedia Sound features classic and modern releases from Africa, Brazil and Latin America. Music from the 1960's to now and rarely heard on the radio in the U.S.



13. American Routes is a PRX produced radio show that focuses on interviews and performances with wide ranging genres of American Roots music including Jazz, Blues, Bluegrass, Country and more.



14. Afropop Worldwide is a Peabody award-winning radio program and online magazine dedicated to music from Africa and the African diaspora. Hosted by one of Africa's best-loved broadcast personalities, Georges Collinet, and produced by Sean Barlow, the radio show is currently distributed by PRI Public Radio International to over 100 stations in the U.S., as well as stations in Europe and Africa.



15. Chor Bazaar features International classics & unknown pop gems with a focus on retro Bollywood & the Latin diaspora, you can also expect to hear Panjabi folk, Qawwali, South Asian filmi (Lollywood, Tollywood & Kollywood) as well as 60's Pop (French, Thai, etc.)
