

**MINOR MODIFICATION TO RELOCATE
KRKR(FM), LINCOLN, NEBRASKA TO VALLEY, NEBRASKA**

1. Chapin Enterprises, LLC ("Chapin"), licensee of FM Station KRKR(FM), Channel 236C2, Lincoln, Nebraska, Fac. ID 54707, respectfully requests a modification of KRKR's license to specify operations on Channel 235A at Valley, Nebraska, in accordance with and pursuant to MB Docket No. 05-210,¹ as the first local broadcast service to be licensed in the City of Valley.

2. The proposed change in KRKR's community of license will result in a more favorable arrangement of allotments as it will bring the first local service to the City of Valley. In order to accommodate the relocation of KRKR to Valley, a change in Class from C2 to A is also required. This change complies with the recent changes in Commission rules as set forth in the Report & Order. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 73.3573(a)(1)(ii).

I. Change in Community of License - Background on the Communities.

A. Lincoln, Nebraska.

3. Lincoln, KRKR's community current of license, is located in Lancaster County. According to 2000 U.S. Census data, the population of Lincoln is 225,581. Including KRKR, there are currently ten full service FM radio stations licensed to Lincoln, four of which are

noncommercial educational stations.² Additionally, there are three AM stations licensed to Lincoln. *Id.*

I. B. Valley, Nebraska.

4. The City of Valley, Nebraska is located in Douglas County. Valley was incorporated as a city in 1864, and is listed in the U.S. Census. *See* Exhibit 2. According to 2000 Census data, the population of Valley is 1,788. *See* Exhibit 3. Valley is not located in any Urbanized Area as defined by the Census Bureau. Currently, there are no broadcast stations licensed to Valley. Valley receives service from at least five radio stations. *See* FCC Form 301, Exhibit 32, Section 307(b) Technical Exhibit, Figure 2, Tabulation of Areas, Populations, and Reception Services within the 60 dBu Coverage Contours. As noted, the Commission has determined that five or more reception services are an "abundant" number of services.

II. Mutually Exclusivity of KRKR's Current Operations and Proposed Operations.

5. Under the Commission's new rules, in order to file for a minor change application to specify a change in community of license, KRKR's proposed facilities must be mutually exclusive with the station's current facilities. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 73.3573(g)(2). KRKR's current facilities at Lincoln are mutually exclusive with KRKR's proposed facilities at Valley. *See* FCC Form 301, Exhibit 32, Section 307(b) Technical Exhibit, Figure 2B, 60 dBu Gain/Loss Areas.

III. Preferable Arrangement of Allotments.

A. The Commission's FM Allotment Priorities and Policies.

6. The Commission will approve a change in community of license of an FM broadcast radio station if the new community "would serve the Commission's allotment priorities and policies better than the allotment in the old community." *See* 47 C.F.R. § 73.3573(g)(1).

The FM allotment priorities are:

1. first time aural service;
2. second fulltime aural service;
3. first local service; and
4. other public interest matters.³

The Commission gives equal weight to the second and third allotment priorities when it evaluates allotment proposals. *Id.* When evaluating FM allotment priorities, the Commission will consider all FM and AM services in the communities, including NCE stations. *Id.* at para. 20. The Commission will also evaluate the loss and gain of service area and population when a change in a station's community of license involves a change in transmitter site.⁴

B. KRKR Would be the First Local Service Licensed to the City of Valley.

7. If the Commission grants the instant application to relocate KRKR to Valley, the station would be the first local service licensed to the city. Therefore, the change in community of license would serve the Commission's third FM allotment priority, the provision of first local

service to a community. As noted, the Commission views the second and third allotment priorities as equal in value. After KRKR has changed its community of license, twelve local full service radio stations will remain licensed to Lincoln. Therefore, a change in community of license for KRKR from Lincoln to Valley results in a preferable arrangement of allotments.

III. C. Transmitter Site in Valley that Meets the Commission's Technical Requirements.

8. With a transmitter site located at 41° 16' 06.0" N, 096° 11' 39.9" W (NAD-27), KRKR will be able to provide a city grade signal contour over Valley. *See* FCC Form 301, Exhibit 32, Section 307(b) Technical Exhibit, Figure 2A, Calculated Coverage Contours.

D. Gain and Loss Area from Change in Community of License.

9. Station KRKR currently serves 291,694 people with a 60 dBu signal from its Lincoln transmitter site. *See* FCC Form 301, Exhibit 32, Section 307(b) Technical Exhibit, Figure 2, Tabulation of Areas, Populations, and Reception Services within the 60 dBu Coverage Contours. If the Commission grants the instant application, KRKR will provide 60 dBu service to 637,675 people. *Id.* This represents a greater than 218% increase in people served. The entire "loss area," the area that will no longer be served by KRKR, will be served by more than five full service broadcast radio stations, as will the "gain area." *Id.*

IV. The City of Valley Is Eligible as a Community of License.

A. Compliance with Section 307(b) of the Commission's Rules.

10. The Commission is required to distribute broadcast facilities among the "several states and communities" pursuant to Section 307(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. Traditionally, a geographic area that is incorporated or appears in the U.S. Census is considered a community under Section 307(b). *See Revision of FM Assignment Policies and*

Procedures, Second Report and Order, 90 FCC 2d 88, 101 (1982). As noted, Valley was incorporated in 1864. Furthermore, the city is listed in the U.S. Census, with a population of 1,788 as of 2000. *See* Exhibits 2 and 3, *infra*.

IV. B. Valley Is Independent from the Urbanized Area.

11. To prevent broadcast licensees from relocating their stations from rural communities to suburban communities for the sole purpose of serving a larger Urbanized Area, as defined by the U.S. Census Bureau, a licensee claiming to provide a first local service must show that its proposed community is independent of the Urbanized Area.⁵ Valley is not located in any Urbanized Area; however, the 70 dBu signal contour of KRKR's proposed facilities would serve 49.5% of the population and 56.3% of the land area in the Omaha, Nebraska-Iowa Urbanized Area (the "Omaha Urbanized Area"). *See* FCC Form 301, Exhibit 32, Section 307(b) Technical Exhibit, Figure 3, Urbanized Area Study.

12. To determine if the proposed community of license is independent from the Urbanized Area the Commission will examine: (1) the extent to which the proposed station will serve the Urbanized Area, (2) the relative populations and proximity of the smaller community and the central city(ies) of the Urbanized Area, and (3) evidence that indicates that the smaller community is independent from the Urbanized Area. *See Tuck*, 3 FCC Rcd at 5377-78. The Commission places more importance on the evidence that indicates the proposed new community is independent from the central city. *See Headland, Alabama and Chattahoochee, Florida*, Report and Order, 10 FCC Rcd 10352, para. 15 (1995).

IV. C. Service to the Omaha Urbanized Area,
Relative Populations of Valley & Omaha and Valley's Proximity to Omaha.

13. As stated, the proposed facilities for KRKR in Valley will provide 70 dBu service to 49.5% of the population and 56.3% of the land area in the Omaha Urbanized Area. The population of Valley (1,788 people) is a little more than 0.45% of the population of Omaha (390,007 people). *See* Exhibit 4. The City of Valley is 18 miles from Omaha, Nebraska, the central city of the Omaha Urbanized Area. *See* Exhibit 5. These figures are comparable to other suburban communities to which the Commission has granted a first local preference.⁶

D. Factors Used to Determine if a Community is Independent from an Urbanized Area.

14. The Commission uses eight evidentiary factors to determine if the proposed community is independent from the central city. The factors are: (1) the extent to which community residents work in the larger metropolitan area, rather than the specified community; (2) whether the smaller community has its own newspaper; (3) whether the community's leaders and residents perceive the specified community as being separate from the larger metropolitan area; (4) whether the specified community has its own local government and elected officials; (5) whether the specified community has its own post office or zip code; (6) whether the community has its own commercial establishments and health facilities; (7) the extent to which the specified community and the central city(ies) in the Urbanized Area are part of the same advertising market; and (8) whether the specified community has its own municipal services such as police,

fire protection, schools, and libraries ("Evidentiary Factors").⁷ The weight of the Evidentiary Factors in this case clearly shows that Valley is independent of the Omaha Urbanized Area.

15. First Evidentiary Factor: Extent to which Community Residents Work in Valley.

Valley is home to a vibrant employer market. As noted in the book *Nebraska...Our Towns*: "Valley...boast[s] a strong chamber of commerce.... Primary employers include Valmont Industries (one of the largest manufacturer [sic] of center pivot irrigation systems and power transmission poles), 3M Corporation, Hartford Sand & Gravel, Lyman-Richey Sandpits, Lentell Grain Elevator, and the public school system." See Marianne Nielsen, *Nebraska...Our Towns*, Valley Chapter (James E. Potter et al eds., Second Century Publication Committee 1997). According to the city government, there are 80 commercial establishments located in Valley that cover a gamut of employers; including auto dealers, grocery stores, restaurants, a marine supply store and a country club. See Exhibit 6. Clearly, there are a number of employers located in Valley, marking it as a separate employment center from Omaha.⁸

This number is derived from the 17 residents that work from home and the 24 residents that walk to work. It is inferred that the residents that walk to work also work in the city. These workers represent more than 4.5% of the working residents of Valley. This percentage of working-age residents who work in their community is less than the percentages of other communities that received allotment preferences from the Commission. It is likely that there are more residents who work within the city, as the Census Bureau does not provide information about the location of employment for Valley residents that drive to work. Regardless, the number of employers located in Valley show that the city has abundant employment opportunities which distinguish Valley from Omaha.

16. Second Evidentiary Factor: Valley Residents have Their Own News Outlets. The residents of Valley are served by their own news outlets that focus on their unique needs and interests independent of the general issues relating to the Omaha Urbanized Area. The Douglas County Post Gazette is the local weekly newspaper that serves Valley and its surrounding communities. See Exhibit 8. The City of Valley also operates two websites that provide residents information about city government meetings, public safety resources, town events and activities and community organizations. See <http://www.valleyne.org> and <http://www.angelfire.com/wizard/aesthetica/valley.htm>. These resources keep Valley's residents informed about local events and address their community's needs.

17. Third Evidentiary Factor: the Residents of the Valley View their City as Separate from the Omaha Urbanized Area. The residents of Valley clearly view their city as separate and distinct from the Omaha Urbanized Area. The Valley Historical Society is an active organization that maintains a museum that holds nearly 4,000 items that bring the history of the city to life. The long history of the town was celebrated in the "Valley Centennial, 1864-1964," a book published by the Valley Historical Society. As noted in *Nebraska...Our Towns*, Valley's sand and gravel pits brought a thriving industry to the town in the 1860's that continues to this day. *Nebraska...Our Towns, supra*. The residents of Valley are proud of their cities history and its current industry. As the citizens state on one of their websites, "Valley, Nebraska carries an abundance of values and morals that are few to other communities. Kindness and hospitality are still viewed as a necessity here." See <http://www.angelfire.com/wizard/aesthetica/valley.htm>.

18. Fourth Evidentiary Factor: Valley has its own Local Government and Elected Officials. The City of Valley has a City Council with four members that it presided over by the

Mayor. *See* Exhibit 9. A City Board of six individuals provides guidance to the council on issues such as city planning, the Valley Library, and parks and cemetery management and also hears appeals of city administration decisions. *Id.*

19. Fifth Evidentiary Factor: Valley Has its Own Zip Code and Post Office. The City of Valley has both a Zip Code (68064, which is shared by the Village of Leshara which has a population of 111 according to 2000 Census data) and a Post Office, which is located at 108 E 2nd Street, Valley, Nebraska 68064-1000. *See* Exhibits 10, 11 and 12, respectively.

20. Sixth Evidentiary Factor: Valley has its Own Commercial Establishments, Religious Institutions and Health Facilities. There is an abundance of commercial enterprises in Valley. As noted previously, Valley is home to Valmont Industries and Hartford Sand & Gravel and has a 3M Corporation office. Several businesses identify themselves with the city by including "Valley" in their name, such as: Valley Floral Company, Valley Health Mart Pharmacy, Valley Marine and Valley Products Corporation. *See* Exhibit 6, *supra*. And the residents have a local bank, the First Nebraska Bank of Valley, to service their banking needs. *Id.* Valley residents can purchase groceries at Dick's Valley Market and Casey's General Store. *See* Exhibit 13. The city also boasts its own industrial park, the Legacy Valley Business Park. *See* Exhibit 14.

21. A number of different religious institutions are located in Valley, including the United Faith Community Church, Bethel Baptist Church, St. John's Catholic Church and St. Mark's Lutheran Church. *See* Exhibit 15. Valley has a number of health facilities to serve its residents, including, the Methodist Physicians Clinic, Guenther Chiropractic, the Valhaven Nursing Center and Community Rehab Physical Therapy and Sports Medicine. *See* Exhibit 16.

Valley also has two animal hospitals; the Ridgeview Animal Hospital and the Riverview Equine Clinic. *See* Exhibit 17.

22. Seventh Evidentiary Factor: Village Is a Separate and Distinct Advertising Market from Omaha. With its local community newspaper, Village's businesses community can reach their customers without relying on advertising outlets in Omaha. Additionally, the residents of Village can take advantage of the newspapers' classified sections to buy and sell items locally and search for local jobs.

23. Eighth Evidentiary Factor: Village Provides its Residents with Municipal Services. The City of Village provides a number of municipal services to its citizens. The city has its own police department which employs 14 officers and Fire and Rescue Department. *See* Exhibit 18. Valley also provides water and sewage services to its residents. *See* Exhibit 19. Valley is home to the Douglas County West School District's Elementary, Middle and High Schools. *See* Exhibit 20. Finally, Valley has a Public Library and Public Park, which includes tennis courts and a swimming pool and baseball fields, which provide cultural facilities and recreational opportunities for its citizens. *See* Exhibits 21 and 22, respectively.

CONCLUSION

24. Chapin's request to change KRKR's community of license furthers the Commission's mandate to distribute broadcast facilities among the states and communities on a fair and equitable basis. The City of Village is a community deserving of its first local broadcast service. As shown, Lincoln, Nebraska will not be detrimentally impacted by the proposed changes. Therefore, Chapin respectfully requests that the Commission grant the instant minor modification application so that KRKR can relocate to Valley, Nebraska.

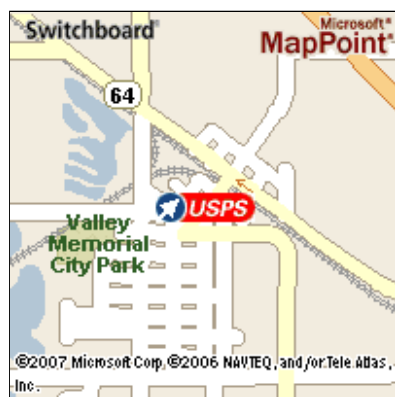
