Request for Special Temporary
Authority to Remain Silent

Dear Mr. Alpert:

This letter concerns the request you filed on May 6, 2014, on behalf of Union Broadcasting Co., Inc. ("UBC"), for Special Temporary Authority to permit Radio Station KBYO-FM to remain silent.

UBC's request states that Station KBYO-FM went silent on April 14, 2014, because it lost its programming source. The request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.¹

UBC's request is granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station KBYO-FM to remain silent not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. **Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for Station KBYO-FM will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m., April 15, 2015.**² See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. § 312(g).

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. It is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed. See 47 C.F.R. §§ 17.6 and 73.1740(a)(4).
