Dear Ms. Ward:

This is in reference to the request filed on January 21, 2014. EGL requests further extension of the STA granted on June 17, 2011, to operate Station WYRD with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits due to copper theft.<sup>1</sup> In support of the request, EGL states that licensee plans to complete a partial proof in February 2014 and requests an extension in the event additional steps are required to resume licensed operations.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.



<sup>1</sup> WYRD is licensed for operation on 1330 kHz with 5 kW ND day and 5 kW DA night.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WYRD may continue to operate with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. EGL must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.<sup>2</sup> EGL must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commissions exposure guidelines. See 47 CFR § 1.1310. We anticipate that EGL will file an FCC Form 302 application containing an acceptable partial proof to allow for resumption of licensed operations before the expiration date shown below.

This authority expires on **July 21, 2014**.
