Interference Complaints and Informal Objection

Dear Counsel:

This letter refers to the following pending filings: (1) the “Objection to License to Cover Application, Complaint of Interference, and Request for Order to Terminate Operations” (Objection-Complaint) filed on March 19, 2018, by New Wavo Communication Group, Inc., licensee of Station KVST(FM), Huntsville, Texas (New Wavo);¹ and (2) the “Supplement to Objection to License to Cover Application, Complaint of Interference, and Request for Order to Terminate Operations” (Supplement),² filed on March 22, 2018. In the Complaints,³ New Wavo alleges interference to KVST(FM) from FM Translator K260DD, Houston, Texas, licensed to Aleluya Broadcasting Network (ABN).⁴

² Collectively, the Objection-Complaint and the Supplement will be referred to as the Complaints.

³ On November 28, 2018, the staff granted ABN’s license application without acting on the Complaints. We find this to be harmless error, because we are dismissing the Complaints due to New Wavo’s failure to respond to the Media Bureau’s (Bureau) written correspondence.


⁴ ABN filed the following responsive pleadings: 1) a July 11, 2019, Letter (dated Jun. 9, 2018); and 2) a July 14, 2018, Letter (dated Jul. 14, 2018).

On September 3, 2019,⁵ the Bureau informed New Wavo that the Complaints did not comply with the Commission's rules (Rules) concerning translator interference.⁶ To continue processing the Complaints, the Bureau directed New Wavo to file, within 30 days, certain additional information detailed in the *Bureau Letter*. The Bureau further informed New Wavo that "failure to submit the required information will result in the dismissal of the Complaints."⁷

To date, New Wavo has failed to respond to the *Bureau Letter*.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that New Wavo Communication Group, Inc.'s "Objection to License to Cover Application, Complaint of Interference, and Request for Order to Terminate Operations" filed on March 19, 2018, and "Supplement to Objection to License to Cover Application, Complaint of Interference, and Request for Order to Terminate Operations" filed on March 22, 2018, ARE DISMISSED.

⁶ In the *Translator Interference Order*, the Commission adopted certain changes to the translator interference rules and stipulated that, once effective, all pending complaints would be decided under the new Rules. See *Amendment of Part 74 of the Commission's Rules Regarding FM Translator Interference*, Report and Order, 34 FCC Rcd 3457 (2019) (*Translator Interference Order*). The Commission further noted that parties involved in pending proceedings would be given an opportunity to submit supplemental material to address the changes. *Id.*, FCC 19-40, at 27, ¶ 49.
