TECHNICAL STATEMENT

This Technical Statement and attached exhibits were prepared on behalf of WWGP Broadcasting Corporation ("WBC"), licensee of WFJA, Channel 288A, Sanford, North Carolina. WBC proposes to relocate and make minor changes to the facilities of WFJA. The proposed relocation will enable WFJA to increase power and height above average terrain. It is noted that this application is being submitted contingently with applications to relocate WRDU, Knightdale, North Carolina, and WNRJ, Poquoson, Virginia. A contingent application agreement is contained elsewhere in this submission.

WBC is proposing a new tower for WFJA, therefore, the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") was notified of this proposal. Once the FAA issues a Determination of No Hazard, the tower will be registered with the Commission. It is noted that WFJA does not meet the Commission's minimum distance separation requirements to two other FM stations. These shortages are addressed in Exhibit A.

All remaining exhibits used to certify the technical portion of the application have been forwarded to WBC and are available for submission to the Commission upon request.¹

1) Only the radio frequency radiation limits were evaluated as part of the environmental assessment. The applicant has, or will, address the remaining issues. Further, all data related to broadcast facilities was extracted from the CDBS database. We assume no liability for errors or omissions in that database which may be adverse to the request contained herein.

It is noted that WBC has interests in AM station WWGP, Sanford, North Carolina.² However, since there is no same service overlap, and these are the only stations in which WBC has interests, it is believed WBC is in compliance with §73.3555 of the Commission's rules.

2) Neither WFJA or WWGP are licensed to a metro county nor are considered "home" to any Arbitron/BIA rated market.
