

**Engineering Statement in Support of
Change to the Community of License**

Introduction

This statement is included to show that the proposed move to the station KVLP will comply with the 307(b) fair distribution guidelines.

Discussion

In the instructions for the new Form 340, the FCC describes several points that are suggested for a showing that the proposed community of license change would result in a preferential arrangement of allotments under section 307(b).

1. Minimum Requirements

The commission has requested that any 307(b) showing contain the following minimum information:

- Since new technical facilities are proposed, the population and area for the new facility are as follows: the 70 dBu contour will contain 17,215 persons and 294.92 sq. km. and the 60 dBu contour will contain 156,656 persons and 939.06 sq. km. area.
- The number of stations licensed to the current community of license is 2. The number of stations licensed to the proposed community of Brewster is 0.
- The number of stations providing service to the current community of license is approximately 9. The number of stations that provide protected service to the proposed community is approximately 27.
- The population of the proposed community is 2,324, according to the 2000 U.S. Census data.
- The proposed city is a licensable community as shown in the separately attached document.

2. Number of Aural Services

The proposed move to KVLP will result in preferential arrangement of facilities. This facility will provide Brewster, OH with its first local aural transmission. The former community of license, Tucumcari, NM, continues to be served by the following facilities:
